

Gospel Meditation

The lens through which we view life makes a difference. It also determines who we choose to learn from and what we allow to shape our thoughts and feelings. For many, life is simply what it appears to be, a given that either through evolution or some other means just came to be. There is no apparent rhyme or reason to things and things can be dissected and understood only in terms of what they empirically present. To the person using this lens, a tree is a tree and a flower is a flower. Their composition and existence can be understood only to the extent that current human knowledge allows. Through this lens, what gives life purpose and meaning? This lens has an essentially unknown beginning and definite end. Once those are accepted, the middle becomes some kind of pursuit of happiness, with values and principles being things that are self-created and found acceptable.

But there is a Divine lens that also exists and deserves mention. It is found when one stumbles upon faith and begins to see things differently. This lens is of God and reveals a Divine Energy and Life that flows through and in all things. Faith then shows us that all that lives come from this one Source of Love. This is the only true lens that can give human beings the purpose and meaning they desperately need. From this perspective, all of life is much more than what is immediately apparent! It now tells and reveals a story about God generous, creative, and unconditional love! The unfolding of the human story is the unfolding of God's story. What meaning our lives have when they are viewed as a part of God's love affair with humanity! We are indeed special.

The lens of our faith asks us to learn from Jesus Christ. Jesus, as the real Bread of Life, shows us our eternal destiny and completes and frames our lives. It is only in allowing ourselves to be taught by Jesus, that faith, hope, and love take on much greater importance. All the relationships in our lives are now structured and ordered using God's primary commandment of love. Jesus, then, is not just some man who lived at some point in history. Jesus is the incarnate Son of God who shows us the way, the truth and the life. Using this lens changes things up a great deal. Looking at the creation that surrounds you and the special unique people you love, what is God trying to teach you about His love for you and the eternal life He wants you to have?

FIRST SPIRITUAL EXERCISES: INNER PEACE IN THE SERVICE OF GOD

Virtual Retreat Hosted by the Jesuit Retreat Center

Tuesday, September 7, from 7:00-8:30 pm Saturday, September 18, from 10:00-11:30 am Saturday, September 25, from 10:00-11:30 am Saturday, October 2, from 10:00-11:30 am Saturday, October 9, from 10:00-11:30 am

This particular retreat, Inner Peace in the Service of God, aims to free sacred desires and loosen one's feet for the service of God. It hopes to bring the retreatant the peace that comes from knowing one's work with Jesus in a particular service is deeply right to who one is.

Each four-week retreat in daily life involves a commitment to 40-50 minutes a day of structured prayer from Monday to Thursday and a weekend exercise. Retreatants meet weekly (via Zoom on Saturday morning) during the retreat to receive guidance from the retreat leaders and to share their experience in small group spiritual conversation with facilitators. IGNATIAN THREADS

Last week we celebrated the Feast of St. Ignatius, notably his "cannonball moment" depicted in the top window panel to the right of the altar. St. Francis Xavier, whose life is depicted in stained glass window panels to the left of the altar, and whose statue is in our narthex, met Ignatius of Loyola when both were students at the University of Paris, himself a roommate of Peter Fabre, another Jesuit saint. His Feast Day was August 1st. Francis Xavier was born into a noble family in Navarre, now a part of Spain. He abandoned ambitions for fame and wealth when Ignatius convinced him to join his followers in service of God and the Church. In 1534 they expressed vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience at Montmartre in Paris. Francis Xavier was among those IGNATIAN

who, in 1539-40, petitioned the pope to allow the First Companions to form the Jesuits as a religious order in the Catholic Church.



VIRTUS TRAINING AND FINGER-PRINTING FOR VOLUNTEERS WORKING WITH GESU CHILDREN

Virtus Training

Virtus Training at Gesu will be Tuesday, <u>August 10</u>, from 6:00-9:00 pm in McAuley Hall. Please register online at **www.virtus.org**. If you attended a Virtus Training session in the past, you do not need to repeat the training.

Fingerprinting for Gesu Volunteers

Background checks are a requirement for VIRTUS certification. Checks can be completed electronically on the VIRTUS website when setting up your personal account.

This training is critical for those who wish to work four or more hours a month, or more than once a month with the children of our parish. 

Gospel Meditation

"You cannot see the forest for the trees" is a widely known saying that can bring wisdom to our understanding of our journey. Often, our sight becomes limited to what is immediately before us. We lose touch with lessons and experiences from the past and promises and hope for the future. As human beings, we have the privilege of being able to choose things. What I like and don't like, want, and don't want can be major preoccupations of our minds and hearts. Our preferences and desires begin to define us more than the simple fact of our being. Who we are matters more than what we are or what we have. If we don't move beyond the external and superficial stuff to what really is of essence, we risk becoming very unsettled, disorientated, angry and unhappy. We fail to see the bigger picture of hope and promise that lies ahead and the Divine Presence that has sustained and carried us before.

We like it when the "now" time of our lives satisfy us. Even the people who witnessed Jesus feed the five thousand got confused and distracted. It felt good when thousands of people were able to eat. They wanted to know what they could do to get this to happen again! But Jesus quickly reminds them that this is not the point of this sign. As much as the now time of our lives is of concern, it is not what is ultimately important. We need to learn the difference between being and doing, drawing more strength from who we are and who God is rather than what is happening around us and the choices we can make. Jesus is the true bread that came down from heaven. Jesus is the very incarnate presence of God who sustains life and assures us that we will not perish. This is not easy to understand and feel. We have to practice being in the presence of ourselves, others, creation and God. We are brought to a holy place when we encounter the sacredness of being. This is real prayer.

Then, we learn to trust. It is when we cease trusting that we start to become afraid, uncertain, apprehensive and doubtful, and overly self-concerned. We even start to grumble. God has our back. That is the essential powerful message of the living bread come down from heaven. God, who is alpha is also omega, the beginning and the end, and has everything in between in his care as well. A woman once remarked that her most powerful God moment happened when she and her husband cuddled with their new baby for a time. Without exchanging words and using only the affection communicated through sight and touch, they rested in being with each other. This brought them to the sacred, where they realized that a greater Being was with them. It was real. They knew that they were part of something bigger, intimate and profound. When we rest in the Living Source of life, we will find that our souls are no longer hungry or thirsty.
