

## Gospel Meditation

People knew over a year in advance that the Pope was coming for a visit to America and the preparations began. Security, space limitations and requirements, protocols, crowd management, itineraries, invitations, regulations, and so much more was necessary to pull this event off effectively. It's not every day that we get a visit from such a prominent dignitary. Thought, effort, meticulous attention to detail and vision all are necessary to make this thing work. After all, he can't just show up in the ordinary and normal daily routines of life and catch people unprepared! Tickets have to be purchased, buses rented, hotel rooms reserved, and travel arrangements made early because it will be impossible to see him if we wait too long!

We do this kind of preparing not only for prominent religious figures but for political dignitaries, notable sports figures, people of fame, and even actors. If an individual intrigues us, we are going to want to do all we have to do to get a "good seat" in the house. Does Jesus Christ captivate this much of our attention? We are asked to prepare the way of the Lord and to do so not with frantic frenzy but patient enthusiasm. We do not have to stand on a street corner making profound announcements about God's coming or become overly zealous in our embrace of the Good News. Our task is quieter, more interior, captivating, and consuming. We are asked to change. We have to conduct our lives with holy devotion.

Is the cost of that ticket too much for you? Don't you want the "best seat" in the house? You don't want to miss Our Lord's arrival when he comes, do you? After all, if he comes while you are going about your daily routines without you even knowing, he may catch you off guard. Or, he may come in disguise looking like a beggar, a prisoner, migrant, refugee, or someone who is lost. Would you be ready to recognize him then? Preparing for the coming of Christ requires a change of mind, heart, and behavior. It is not adequate to simply do the things we always do. We want our lives to speak of the exciting news of Christ's coming and the joy that the Gospel brings. It has to do with our demeanor, values, priorities, choices, and how we structure daily routines. Of course, it involves sacrifice. All anticipations do! Are you excited, captivated, enthusiastic, and sitting on the edge of your seat eager to celebrate his coming among us at Christmas, and waiting for him to come again? If not, why not?

## FR. KARL KISER, SJ, NAMED NEW LEADER OF MIDWEST PROVINCE JESUITS



Gesu's Pastor, Fr. Karl Kiser, SJ, has been appointed by Fr. General Arturo Sosa, SJ, as the next provincial of the USA Midwest Province of the Society of Jesus (the Jesuits). Fr. Kiser will assume his leadership role in 2021. He succeeds Fr. Brian G. Paulson, SJ, who was named provincial of the Chicago-Detroit Province in 2014 and became provincial of the new USA Midwest Province when the existing Chicago-Detroit and Wisconsin Provinces came together in June 2017.

### FROM OUR HOUSE TO YOUR HOUSE

Week of 12/6/20 -The Second Sunday of Advent

**GATHER**: Begin simply by saying "Bless Us, O Lord!" and make the Sign of the Cross.

**LISTEN**: Use a portion of the reading this week to read aloud.

Our Gospel for today is Matthew 1:1-5, 7-8. We meet the cousin of Jesus, John, who was known by the name John the Baptist. He was and is considered a prophet, just like Isaiah in the first reading today. He announces the coming of the Lord, and instructs them that he might be different than the one they might be expecting. But he would be even more; he would be the Son of God. John preached baptism, but in a different way that we might have explained it - a baptism of repentance, a baptism of water and the Holy Spirit.

Pause a little.

**SHARE**: Use this thought or question for family sharing:

Many came to be surprised at this Jesus about whom John preached. They were expecting perhaps a military leader or strong aggressor to help them face the difficult times of Roman rule in their land. Instead, they discover a man who taught, healed, and urged them to turn from their ways to follow him with their entire lives. And many did! Did you ever wonder if you would follow Jesus if you were there then? What does it mean to follow Jesus with all our heart? What would that look like in our family, among our friends?

Can you think of one thing you and your family could do this week that expresses following Jesus? Maybe you could choose something from the parish Advent giving tree? (It is virtual this year! Look in the bulletin and website for more information!)

**PRAY FOR:** After sharing, consider all those you want to remember in prayer today.

Light the second candle on your Advent wreath. Thank God for all the blessings you and your family share, great and small! Give thanks for them, and then add anyone in need who could use support, or encouragement, or a prayer of hope!

**GIVE THANKS**: Conclude with: "Bless Us, O Lord, and these your gifts which we are about to receive from your bounty through Christ our Lord. Amen."

# December: Clothe the Maked



Through the Corporal Works of Mercy, Christians are called to clothe the naked. This corporal work was actively embraced by St. Vincent de Paul.

Vincent de Paul was born to peasant parents in 1581. He entered the seminary in 1596 at the age of 15, and was ordained at the age of 19. In 1625, he became the chaplain and tutor to the wealthy Gondi family. Here he began his ministry to the poor. The Countess de Gondi and her husband financially supported de Paul's group of missionaries who worked among the poor tenant farmers and country folk. His zeal for the poor compelled Vincent to lead a group of missionaries, later known as the Vincentians, to serve the poor in the small towns and villages of the country. His heart for the poor led him to be declared the patron saint of charitable societies after he was canonized in 1737.

The society that bears his name was started in France in 1833. A university student, Frederic Ozanam, was challenged in a debate: "What do you do besides talk, to prove the faith you claim is in you?" The twenty year old accepted the challenge and, along with several of his fellow students, he started a "Conference of Charity" which quickly changed its name to the Saint Vincent de Paul Society, in honor of the exemplary saint. The good works of this organization inspired many, and within a few years the number of followers increased and organizations quickly spread to other cities and towns in France. In 1845, twelve years after the establishment of the Society in France, the first American conference was formed in St. Louis at the Old Cathedral. Over 170 years later, the Society has grown to serve the poor in St. Louis and beyond.

While clothing the naked is a primary focus, the Gesu volunteers also address the needs of the poor in our neighborhoods on a deeper level. The command to clothe the naked intrinsically calls them to recognize the human dignity of everyone they visit. They give physical and spiritual support to the poor and acknowledge the divine in those who are most in need. We are all called to answer the question posed to Bl. Frederic Ozanam. "What do you do besides talk, to prove the faith you claim is in you?"

Open your hearts. Consider becoming active in the SVDPS at Gesu. Interesting fact - The Ozanam Center in East Cleveland bears his name. We are privileged to share in his mission through our St. Vincent de Paul group with Communion of Saints and many parishes on our side of town.



Talk to your advisors and IRA administrator for more information and to be sure that your IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution gift is made directly from an IRA to a qualified charity such as our parish.
