

Gospel Meditation

From the time we are born into this world until we die, our human radar picks up signals about how to respond to life. What we picked up on when we were very young carries an even greater power. The messages we receive and process tell us what we are "supposed" to do with our feelings, how to understand and cope with disappointment, anxiety, failure, death, illness, and what to expect out of life. As life unfolds for us, these radar messages kick in and resonate in us at very deep levels. Sometimes what we have learned is helpful and sometimes it is not. The stories we have been told, especially when we are young, about how life is best lived and how to negotiate its pain carry a heavy weight.

Life can be challenging and frightening. Sometimes, it really hurts to be a human being. It also can be quite unpredictable and, at times, unfair. We face our vulnerability and brokenness of all kinds: physical, emotional and spiritual. It doesn't take much for life to quickly fall apart. What we knew to be familiar and true is gone and something we relied upon, physically, emotionally or spiritually, can be taken away. It is hard to confront our limitations and sit with our incompleteness. Often, life hurts us so much that we find ourselves sitting in a pool of sadness, not sure what we are supposed to do. It is particularly hard when the signals we have inherited tell us that we need to be successful in what we do, and we have to avoid life's unfairness. We can feel like a failure, wondering what precisely we did to deserve this fate, or ruminate about what we did not do correctly. But it's really not about us. We are part of a bigger picture and a much more fascinating story!

If we cease doing battle with life's incompleteness and see ourselves, as God does, on a journey toward wholeness and completeness we can better accept our disappointments and stand firm. The prophets told us, and Jesus reassured us: Be strong! Fear not! Sometimes we have to update our stories and replace them with newer, more accurate ones. When we make God's story our own and tune our radar into His voice, what we hear is all about restoration, healing, and rejuvenation! This is true even when we think we have hit rock bottom and can go no further. There is always hope. Remember the words of Julian of Norwich: God made us, God loves us, and God keeps us. Now, listen to God when He says, "be opened!" Be healed and allow your stories to change.

CLARIFICATION FOR WHAT TO DO AT COMMUNION TIME!

According to the Diocesan guidelines, the faithful will:

- STAND during the distribution and reception of Holy Communion for the singing of the Communion Hymn. (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, 50, 124, 128)
- KNEEL during the period of sacred silence after the distribution of Holy Communion. This period of silence should begin as soon as the distribution of Holy Communion has been completed. At this point the faithful may sit or kneel.
- The faithful are not required to stand during the purification of vessels, or until the reposition of the Blessed Sacrament (GIRM, 43).

MASS INTENTIONS

The practice of requesting a Mass to be offered for loved ones, living or deceased, is a beautiful and wonderful part of our Catholic tradition. The offering is \$10 per Mass. If you would like a Mass said, please come to the parish office during regular business hours 9:00 am - 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday, and we would be happy to assist you.

- 1. We do not currently have any Masses available in 2021. If the current weekday schedule continues, we will add more 8:30 am Mass Intentions in November.
- 2. The Mass Intention book for 2022 is now open for 7:30 am weekday and weekend Mass Intentions. Once the current weekday Mass schedule is evaluated, we may also be able to schedule 8:30 am weekday Mass Intentions.

IGNATIAN THREADS

Francis Xavier died of fever on December 3, 1552, on the island of Sancian, while awaiting a boat to take him to mainland China. He had set his sights on furthering his missionary successes in Japan and other parts of Asia. His incorrupt body was first buried on an island beach, then moved to Portuguese Malacca where an open grave in the church still marks his burial place. On December 11, 1553, his body was shipped to Goa, where he had worked to restore Christianity. Much later, on December 2, 1637, it was placed in a glass container encased in a silver casket with 32 plates depicting episodes from his life. Francis' dream of bringing the Gospel to China would be realized by later Jesuits. The correspondence between Francis Xavier and Ignatius Loyola would inspire many IGNATIAN_ young men to enter the Society of Jesus and serve as missionaries in Threads his footsteps.

A message from Bishop Malesic on keeping people safe during the pandemic

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

The latest information from federal, state and local public health agencies informs us that the Delta variant of the COVID-19 virus is surging in our area, causing increased illness and hospitalizations at levels not seen since the spring. For the safety of all who worship at Catholic parishes throughout the Diocese of Cleveland, I strongly encourage you -- whether vaccinated or not vaccinated -- to wear a face mask while attending Mass indoors. All who want to attend Mass, and who are otherwise vulnerable, should feel safe and welcome inside our sacred spaces. Please use charity and patience with those who do not wish to comply with this strongly stated request. You also might want to consider wearing a face mask for other indoor gatherings, especially for those not yet fully vaccinated. Wearing masks outdoors is not generally required except for activities involving close contact with others who are not fully vaccinated.

Those who are ill, have significant health risk factors or care for someone who is immune-compromised or ill, as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety about contracting the coronavirus in a large group of persons are not obliged to attend Mass.

Pope Francis recently offered a message of hope and unity to the world in an effort to continue increasing confidence in the COVID-19 vaccines, specifically in communities disproportionately affected by the virus. "Thanks to God's grace and to the work of many, we now have vaccines to protect us from COVID-19," the pope said. "Getting the vaccines that are authorized by the respective authorities is an act of love. I pray to God that each one of us can make his or her own small gesture of love; no matter how small, love is always grand."

I am fully vaccinated and recommend the same for my family and friends. In consideration of others, I also am wearing a mask during the distribution of holy Communion and I strongly encourage those distributing holy Communion at Mass to wear a mask while distributing as well.

Remember that the situation seems to be ever changing. This request to wear face masks is temporary and will be changed once this current level of increased coronavirus cases is over. Stay connected to information coming from national, state and local health authorities, and stay home and get tested for COVID when you are not feeling well. Following these recommendations will go a long way in helping to keep you and others around you safe.

We are all tired of this pandemic, but we must not forget that we are called to care for the health of others in times of crisis and must continue to protect our healthcare system and medical workers.

May God bless and watch over us in our time of need.

St. Dominic's Faithful Citizenship Social Action Committee educates, advocates and provides direct assistance on local and global issues pertaining to Catholic Social Teaching.

- Lawyers are needed. Background in immigration law is helpful but not necessary. If you are willing to offer your assistance, please contact Adriana Coppola at acoppola@ccdocle.org or (216) 939-3726 or Allyson DiPofi at akdipofi@ccdocle.org or (216) 939-3735.
- It costs \$575 just to file one Humanitarian Parole Application for an individual from Afghanistan.
 Some families are trying to apply for ten family members to arrive in the United States. For those who would like to help, please visit the Refugee Response Afghan Support Fund located at: https://www.refugeeresponse.org/give.
- Transportation is needed. They would like to set up a ride network to assist with errands, grocery store, etc. RTA bus passes are also needed. To help, contact Jodie Bowers at JBowers@ stdominicchurch.net.
- Rental housing is needed. If you know of anyone with safe, lead-free housing, apartments, or rooms for rent, contact Jodie Bowers at JBowers@stdominicchurch.net.
- As families arrive, they anticipate a need for meals, clothing and hospitality. More will be shared as this is an evolving crisis.

GESU PARISH RAISES \$167,280 FOR CATHOLIC CHARITIES ANNUAL APPEAL

Thanks to the generosity of 246 donors at Gesu, we have exceeded our parish goal by \$9,937 for the 2021 Annual Appeal! We're thrilled that we reached 106% of our goal, but that does not mean the Appeal is over.

Every day, Catholic Charities sees an increase in requests for services and programs that are proven to transform lives. The need continues and we hope your support will also continue. Together, we can make a difference. St. Augustine Hunger Center in Tremont has been providing essential services to its community for over 50 years. In normal times, the Hunger Center would serve about 300 meals per day in a traditional sit-down style soup kitchen, but at the beginning of the pandemic, the center began serving 200 to-go trays and 300 delivery meals per day.

One person who began receiving meals during the pandemic is Pat Field, a parishioner of St. Augustine since 1993 and president of the Blind Association at the church. Speaking about one of the workers who delivers her meals, Pat praised, "The meals are good – and one thing about it is Doug, who delivers my meals. Since I am blind, he tells me exactly what I have."

Pat has meals delivered to her apartment seven days a week, two meals per day, which include a vegetable, a salad, meat, a starch and bread. By receiving these deliveries, she does not have to cook and saves money from not having to venture to the grocery store and shop for every meal.


