Gospel Meditation

St. Oscar Romero said, "We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that. This enables us to do something and to do it very well. It may be incomplete, but it is the beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest."

There were a group of ladies many years ago who made quilts. They were beautiful creations reflecting inspirational designs artfully composed from the simple scraps of fabric each woman would bring to their individual pieces. There was no plan for the finished project as each finished work became the combined creation of what each woman contributed. They abounded in vibrant colors and dazzled the beholder with intricate patterns and their myriad textures. They were so beautiful that they became coveted family treasures passed from generation to generation. Those women never realized the power of their work. Countless babies rested in the comfort of those quilts warmly nestled in the legacy of tradition they were fortunate to inherit. They adorned countless homes with their beauty and brought joy and solace to many faces.

We cannot do everything. We are not meant to. Our work in life is to contribute our individual piece, a piece that reflects the unique thumbprint I claim as my own. We only have to do small things well. Then, as St. Oscar Romero reminds us, the Lord's grace will enter and do the rest. We have to trust that this is true just as those women trusted in the eventual beauty of their final work.

Eucharistic blessings are blessings that start small and multiply. We all come to life with only a few loaves of bread and a few fish. Not any single one of us has all that it takes to transform our world. Who knows what God will do with the little we have and how many will benefit from our kindness, compassion, wisdom, courage, conviction, love, warmth, zeal, faith and hope? That young lad never dreamed that his few leftovers would do all that they did. God shows up in unexpected ways! Where would life's adventure and fun be if it were any other way? Being able to be part of bringing God's creative, transforming healing to the world opens us up to wonder, awe and excitement! We can all bring our little piece to the bigger work of God that can result in being a coveted jewel passed generation to generation. This is good news indeed!

Bread and wine transform into Christ's Body and Blood and we become what we eat. Trust that.

Next weekend we will celebrate the Feast of St. Ignatius and the start of a special Ignatian year. Ignatius died in Rome in 1556 on July 31, which we celebrate annually as his feast day. His body was covered with his priestly garments and placed in a wooden shrine, which was buried in the small Maria della Strada Church (name of our pastoral center – parish office). That church was demolished in 1568 and replaced with the Church of the Gesu. The body of Saint Ignatius was put into a new coffin and reinterred in the Church of the Gesu in Rome, which is the mother church of the Society of Jesus. He was beatified on July 27, 1609 and was canonized by Pope Gregory XV on March 12, 1622. He is honored as patron saint of Catholic soldiers and, of course, remembered as one of a group of priests who formed the Society of Jesus IGNATIAN and as the first Superior General

Virtus Training at Gesu will be Tuesday, <u>August 10</u>, from 6:00-9:00 pm in McAuley Hall. Please register online at **www.virtus.org**. If you attended a Virtus Training session in the past, you do not need to repeat the training.

Fingerprinting for Gesu Volunteers

Background checks are a requirement for VIRTUS certification. Checks can be completed electronically on the VIRTUS website when setting up your personal account.

This training is critical for those who wish to work four or more hours a month, or more than once a month with the children of our parish. YOU WILL NOT BE ABLE TO BEGIN COACHING OR OTHER VOLUNTEERING WITH CHILDREN AT GESU UNTIL YOU HAVE COMPLIED WITH THESE DIOCESAN REQUIREMENTS. GESU EARLY CHILDHOOD PROGRAMS

We are registering now for both our Gesu Early Childhood programs, Happy Together and TOPS (Time Out for Parents).

Happy Together is a parent/child class for children 16 - 30 months old. It takes place on Monday mornings during the school year from 10:00-11:00 am. The children free play, do art projects and easel painting, and have circle time.

TOPS (Time Out for Parents) is a drop off program for two and three year olds. Two-year-old children turning two by 9/30 can attend one morning per week, Tuesday through Friday. Children who turn three by 12/31 have the option to do two mornings per week. There is free play, art, circle time, and gym and playground time.

Both classes take place in our awesome room full of toys in the lower level of Gesu School! The fall session begins in mid-September and concludes the week before Christmas. FAMILIES WITH MEMBERS OVER AGE 23

If someone in your family reaches age 23, our parish data system reclassifies him or her as an "adult" and changes member status to "inactive," meaning former parishioner. In other words, he or she will no longer be a registered parishioner at Gesu. At age 23 a family member needs to register as an individual on a new membership. 


