Gospel Meditation


Did you ever stop and realize that there is no earthly gain that can ever really satisfy us? Think of winning the Lotto. On this side of the winning ticket, it's all about the money, the new car, house, vacations, bank accounts and infinite pleasures. The possibility of acquiring all of these earthly securities brings us back again and again to the purchase of a ticket. Then, one day we win! Our dreams are fulfilled, and happiness is on the horizon. Then one day, we wake up and realize that nothing has really changed, and I am not as satisfied as I thought I was or would be. I find myself living in my incompleteness and with my profound sorrow and grief. I did not find joy.

Glimpses of joy are possible, but not by material means. They are brought to us through incredible experiences of connection that bring us face to face with real and authentic faith, hope and love. And, they are glimpses and do not last. The moment we find ourselves looking back at them, they are gone, and we find ourselves remembering the moment in memory. To carry joy within us is to realize that it is not something I create, manufacture or even acquire. It is not able to be purchased. It is a gift. My need for joy mirrors my need for eternity, for a Creator who has a claim on the very essence of who I am and desires a home within me. As C. S. Lewis discovered, joy is a surprise that speaks to my very soul and is given as gift by the God who loves me.

The beauty of Advent is found in discovering the beauty of the gift of joy. God has visited his people for no other reason than to show them where and how to find joy! All of our human and earthly joy experiences are always only glimpses. They never satisfy us, sustain us or fulfill us. It is only God who is the joy of my soul. Real, Divine experiences of joy catch us off guard, make us stop and become aware, bring a feeling of awe and rightness and have an eternal Otherness about them. Nothing created by humans can ever come close to this. We probably will not fully realize the truth of all of this until we actually meet God face to face in heaven one day. Then, in that sacred moment when our hearts leap for joy we will understand what we have been tirelessly searching for all along. Intense gratitude will most surely follow.

CHRISTMAS LITURGIES



The Gesu Parish Staff is preparing for this year's Christmas liturgies. As you know, it is a unique year, with the COVID-19 pandemic still widespread throughout the country. We are taking precautions to make sure parishioners, guests and our staff remain safe during this time. Due to social distancing requirements, we are only able to accommodate up to 200

people per liturgy, including special liturgies such as Christmas Eve and Christmas day.

Please note that the dispensation from the obligation to attend Holy Days or Sunday Mass remains in effect. **The 4:00 pm Christmas Eve Liturgy will be live streamed and will be available for viewing during and after the liturgy.** Additionally, there are a number of resources on our parish website to assist families who choose to worship from home, or to incorporate some rituals into their family gathering on Christmas and throughout the season.

To help manage attendance, we are requiring everyone, parishioners and guests, to make reservations in advance for the Christmas Mass they wish to attend. Online reservations can be made by visiting our website www.churchofthegesu.org beginning on Monday, December 14. You can also call the parish office at (216) 932-0617 on or after December 14 to make a reservation.

The complete list of Masses is as follows: December 24 at 4:00 pm, 5:30 pm, and 10:30 pm in the Church; December 24 at 4:05 pm in the Family Center; December 25 at 10:00 am and 11:30 am in the Church.

We appreciate your understanding and wish you and your family a safe and healthy Christmas Season.



FROM OUR HOUSE TO YOUR HOUSE

Week of 12/13/20

GATHER: Begin simply by saying "Bless Us, O Lord!" and make the Sign of the Cross.

LISTEN: Use a portion of the reading this week to read aloud.

Our Gospel for today is John 1:6-8, 23-28. We hear about John the Baptist again this week. This time he speaks those powerful words, "Make straight the way of the Lord!" and then he points the way to Jesus, someone they do not yet recognize! He is the one for whom they have all awaited!

Pause a little,

SHARE: Use this thought or question for family sharing:

Many times we miss what is right in front of us. That's what was happening with John and the people of his time. Even though they were drawn to John, John's mission was to point out someone even greater who would become the Savior of all. He would be the Light for the world! Like today, they often missed who Jesus was and is. Our world still seeks light and hope! Can you think of ways that people are missing this message? Look at the news this week, and find examples of hope, and examples where hope and light are most needed.

The third candle on the Advent wreath is pink! It reminds us of the joy that comes as we near the great feast of Christmas, but also as the light that leads others to that hope!

PRAY FOR: After sharing, consider all those you want to remember in prayer today.

Today is also the feast of St. Lucy, a saint who is depicted as bringing the light into the darkness. In Scandinavian countries, a young girl is chosen to wear a beautiful crown with candles to symbolize bringing the Light into the darkness during this Advent season.

Light the third candle and pray that the Light of Jesus might move into the dark and shadowy places that need that light. And also pray that we might grow stronger in being that hope for someone else. In this busy week, can we reach out to someone through a phone call, a card or a visit? (*Continued*)

Bring all of these people to our prayer today ...
Come, Lord Jesus, come!

GIVE THANKS: Conclude with: "*Bless Us, O Lord, and these your gifts which we are about to receive from your bounty through Christ our Lord. Amen.*"

IGNATIAN PRAYER & FAITH SHARING



FEATURED ARTICLE

December: Clothe the Naked



The Corporal Works of Mercy deal with care for a person's bodily needs. Food and water stand at the top of the list, and clothing comes right behind (see Sir 29:21). Jesus described this merciful work as "naked and you clothed me" (Mt 25:36). While nakedness can mean the complete lack of clothing, it more often means destitute, a result of extreme poverty.

Emotionally, nakedness - poverty - is humiliating, and clothing eliminates the embarrassment and shame. Physically, clothing is needed to protect the body from the elements. Thin or lighter clothing is needed in sunlight to prevent sunburn and skin cancer; heavier clothing is needed in cooler conditions to prevent chill, hypothermia and frostbite; work clothing is needed to protect from abrasions and slivers; and footwear is needed to protect from cuts, bruises and falls.

To clothe the naked as an act of mercy is firmly grounded in Scriptures and has been put into action by saints throughout history. A classic example is the story of St. Martin of Tours. As a young man he was a Roman soldier, and one wintry day he was riding on patrol and came upon a poor beggar at the city gate. The man was old, hunched and almost naked, shivering and suffering from the cold. The beggar cried out for alms, but Martin had no money. With only the clothes on his back, Martin withdrew his sword and sliced his tattered, thick military cloak in two and wrapped one piece around the beggar. That night, Martin had a dream in which he saw Jesus in heaven wrapped in the same cloak he had given to the beggar. An angel asked Jesus, "Master, why are you wearing that battered old cloak?" Jesus replied, "My friend Martin gave it to me."

When it comes to providing clothing, charity begins at home with the purchase of adequate clothing for the family, and it continues with dressing young children and those with a sickness or disability that hinders their ability to dress themselves. Beyond the home, it includes alms-giving to organizations like the St. Vincent de Paul Society, the Red Cross or a local emergency shelter. It is also desirable to go through one's closets and drawers periodically to gather clothes to be donated to Goodwill or other organizations that assist the poor.

HOPE IN A TIME OF PANDEMIC



YEAR-END GIVING

This provision is in effect only for the 2020 tax year. And, if you are 70 ½ or older, you may be able to make a gift of a Qualified Charitable Distribution from your IRA that will help us in our ministry and reduce your taxable income. Talk to your advisors and IRA administrator for more information and to be sure that your IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution gift is made directly from an IRA to a qualified charity such as our parish.
