The Sacred Paschal Triduum begins Thursday evening with Mass of the Lord’s Supper, continues Friday with the Passion of the Lord, climaxes with The Easter Vigil in the Holy Night on Saturday, and formally concludes with Evening Prayer on Easter Sunday. These three days are experienced as one, but each one is different. Historically, these three days developed out of the early Christian practice of initiating new members during the night of vigil preceding the celebration of the Lord’s Resurrection. By the 4th and 5th centuries, pilgrims were visiting the Holy Land, gathering and praying at the traditional sites referred to in the Gospel narratives, and bringing these practices back to Europe. Today’s rites call us once more to consider how we are called to live the Paschal Mystery daily. Thursday recalls the Passover meal, the Lord’s Supper and includes the Washing of the Feet—which is an action of humility and service and expresses the responsibility of those who share the Eucharist. It was at the Last Supper that Jesus instituted the priesthood and the Holy Eucharist. Holy Thursday leads us into Good Friday. We are asked by Jesus to spend an hour with him in the garden before he is arrested and begins his Passion. Friday is a day of reflection and quiet prayer in addition to our coming together to commemorate and participate in Jesus’ Passion and Death. On Good Friday the Church does not celebrate the Sacraments, except for Penance and Anointing of the Sick. During The Adoration of the Holy Cross we as a community adore the risen Christ. By most ancient traditions, the Easter Vigil in the Holy Night is the night of keeping vigil for the Lord. It is the greatest and most noble of all solemnities and when Holy Church meditates on the wonders the Lord God has done for His people. It is during this night that new members are welcomed into the Church and everything is new—the oils, the candles, the Baptismal waters... Then on Easter Sunday, we participate in the triumph of the Resurrection and our salvation. *Gay Snell*
