

### LITURGY CORNER

Next Sunday is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. It is celebrated the Sunday after Pentecost to commemorate the mystery of the Trinity: Three Persons in One God (see Matthew 28: 18-20). A votive Mass for the Trinity dates from the 7th century. An office, which is still prayed today, was composed in the 10<sup>th</sup> century. Pope John XXII then added this feast to the Liturgical Calendar in 1334. As Christianity spread in the early centuries, growing by as much as forty percent per decade, so did the need to preserve the ritual of Holy Mass. The ritual form was carefully passed from culture to culture as seen in the first letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians (1 Cor 11:23-25). The term Mass comes from the Latin words of dismissal: Ite, missa est ("Go, it is ended') and came into usage during Medieval times. The early Christians referred to Holy Mass as "the breaking of bread". Other terms were "the offering", "the oblation", "the liturgy" which comes from the Greek leitourgia meaning "public service". The Latins, from an early date, used the term "sacrament", while the Greeks favored "the mysteries." Other terms came in and went out, with the term "the Eucharist", from the Greek eucharistia, which means literally, "thanksgiving", becoming the preferred term because it was the preferred term in the Gospels and by Saint Paul (see Mark 14:23, Matthew 26:27, Lue 22:17, and 1 Cor 11:24). The early Christians celebrated the Mass because the Lord Jesus commanded them to do so. Because Jesus had asked them to do as he did, the Apostles and subsequent generations would preserve Jesus' words and actions as something precious and even divine. Gav Snell

# A mission of San Clemente Catholic Church

During the 1680 Pueblo Revolt the San Antonio Church at Isleta was destroyed. When the Spanish returned the Church was rebuilt and renamed for San Agustin. In 1789, to honor their beloved San Antonio, the Indians of Isleta and the Hispanics of Los Lentes built a new capilla (chapel). The 1790 Spanish census mentions the "Pueblo de San Antonio en Los Lentes" and named the Lente, Saenz, Piro and Chavez families as being among the many families who occupied the pueblo.

During the mid 19th century the "bulto" of San Antonio arrived from Mexico and by the late 1800s the stations of the cross in "Folk Federal" neo-classical style were brought to the capilla along with other statues of saints. These later additions to the capilla reflected the French influence of New Mexico'c first bishop, Jean Baptiste Lamy, who took office in 1851.

The original chapel walls are 30 inches thick and are constructed of 'terrone', a type of adobe block cut from the Isleta swamp. The bell was installed in 1880. The original building was probably rectangular with the current cruciform wings and sanctuary added at a later date. In 1912 a metal roof replaced the original flat roof and at one time there may have been a clerestory window through which sunlight illuminated the altar.

The San Antonio fiesta is still held at the capilla every year on the weekend closest to the feast of St. Anthony (12 June) and many former residents of Los Lentes return to share in the festivities honoring St. Anthony and the community.
