LITURGY CORNER

March 6 is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent. Ash Wednesday is not a Holy Day of Obligation, but is important liturgically and spiritually as it begins the Church's primary penitential season in the liturgical year. All Sundays are the Lord's Day, but during Lent they are more solemn—the absence of flowers, not singing the *Alleluia* or the *Gloria*, purple vestments, and a difference in the music. On these Sundays of Lent we do not downplay the importance of Sunday as the Lord's Day, but instead tone it down, so to speak, in anticipation of the greatest Sunday of the Liturgical Year—Easter. We enter the church in silence, preparing ourselves for the celebration of Holy Mass and the receipt of Jesus in the Eucharist. We leave the church in silence, acknowledging those who wish to stay and pray. In the silence of our entering and leaving we begin to grow hungry for the triumphant mysteries of Easter. As we get closer to Easter we begin to miss the *Gloria* even more and long to sing with the angels when we once again include the *Gloria* in our Mass prayers. We look forward to Jesus' Resurrection as we journey quietly toward his Crucifixion. These forty days are days of prayer, almsgiving and fasting. In these ways we try to become as fully as possible the baptized people we are. In our fasting, not only in what we eat but in what we do, we hunger for the things in God's world as we look forward to singing *Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia* once again. *Gay Snell*

Building Fund Phase II Update

As of January 31, 2019, we have received pledges in the amount of **\$551,809.75**, from which we have collected **\$191,931.26**, which leaves a balance of **\$357,878.50** to be paid. **Next weekend is our First Annual Mardi Gras Calcutta Fundraiser!** If you have not yet purchased your tickets, they will be available after all of the Masses this weekend, or at the Parish Office. **What is a Calcutta?** All sold tickets will have the buyers' names on a board in numerical order. There will be up to 27 boards with 25 names on each board. For example, if you bought ticket #1, your name will be placed on the first board in the #1 slot. At the Calcutta, each board will be auctioned to the highest bidder and the highest bidder wins the board. If the last ticket drawn is on that board, that bidder will win half of the money collected for all of the boards. For example, if the total bids on all of the boards is \$5,000, you will win \$2,500. In addition, the very first ticket drawn will win \$500, every 10th ticket drawn will win \$100, and every 100th ticket drawn will win \$250 and the very last ticket drawn will win \$10,000.

Becoming Instruments of God's Peace

Peace is the harmony of living together in right relationships. The Bible contains God's guidelines for how a community is meant to live in harmony with God and with one another. The actions prohibited by God's 10 Commandments reveal the truest ways to destroy a community—disregarding God by worshiping and serving false gods, disregarding others by killing, lying, stealing, and violating others' bodies and goods. Jesus reveals his new guidelines for life in the community desiring to live under God's kingdom rule. Following these guidelines is also our daily challenge as Jesus' disciples. St. Francis of Assisi wrote a prayer to remind his followers of their goal as Jesus' disciples—to become instruments of peace and harmony—first in themselves and then in their behavior towards others. His prayer offers us a way to use our Lenten time to reflect on how we also might become instruments of peace in a world torn by divisions, full of hatred, injury, doubt, despair, darkness and sadness that desperately cries out for love, pardon, faith, hope, light and joy. Let us pray that we may become instruments of peace to all those God places in our path.

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace;
Where there is hatred, let me sow love,
where there is injury, pardon,
where there is doubt, faith,
where there is despair, hope,
where there is darkness, light,
