Feast of Corpus Christi Procession Sunday, June 23, 2019 after 12:00 Mass

San Clemente Parish will have its annual Corpus Christi procession with the Blessed Sacrament under guarded canopy on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi (Sunday, June 23, 2019) following the 12:00 Mass. In the past years various ministries and organizations have hosted the altars that are set up and decorated on the church grounds. Last year we invited parishioners to host these altars and would like to extend that same invitation again this year!

The altars will be located in the Gathering Room, the Parish Hall and the Courtyard, (the first and fifth will be in the church.) This is a venerable Church tradition and an outward demonstration of our Catholic Faith in the real presence of the risen Christ under the appearance of the Consecrated Host.

LITURGY CORNER

Next Sunday is the Solemnity of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, Corpus Christi. It is customary and desirable to have a procession on this day, which will take place next week at San Clemente after the 12:00 Mass. Participation in this procession is a blessing to each of us and to the parish. "Saint John Paul II reminds us that, in commemorating the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, the Church 'does not only celebrate the Eucharist but solemnly bears it in procession, publicly proclaiming that the sacrifice of Christ is for the salvation of the whole world.' We rejoice in this post-Easter expression of our Eucharistic affection in order to deepen our attachment to the unique and unending Event that transforms our lives." (Magnificat June 2018) The feast began in Liege in 1246 and was extended throughout the Church in the West by Pope Urban IV in 1264. Saint Thomas Aquinas wrote the Liturgy of the Hours for this feast. The custom of the Corpus Christi procession dates back to the 14th century. During the Middle Ages, processions had developed into splendid pageants of devotion and

honor. This day was also called Day of Wreaths in France and sections of central Europe. Huge bouquets of flowers were

carried as well as being attached to homes. Green arches spanned streets, and in the procession men



wore small wreaths on their left arms and the girls wore them on their heads. In Poland, the wreaths were blessed on the eve of the feast, and later the people decorated their homes with them. *Gay Snell*
