LITURGY CORNER

We all know that Jesus is present Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Holy Eucharist. But what does this mean in terms of how we behave in His presence? When we enter any Roman Catholic Church we look first for the Sanctuary Candle—a sure sign that we have found the Tabernacle and Jesus present there. We then dip our fingers into the Holy Water, bless ourselves with the Sign of the Cross—a remembrance of our Baptism—, and then bow or genuflect to Jesus in the Tabernacle as we enter and as we exit the pews. In these days of the flu and other viruses, we will be receiving Jesus only in one species—His Sacred Body. (We make a throne with our hands and receive him there, promptly placing the consecrated Host in our mouths.) We are still receiving him Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity as even the smallest crumb contains his Body and Blood in its entirety. Those who are not able to take the Sacred Body and thus receive Holy Communion in the Precious Blood only, are also receiving Jesus in his entirety. Again the smallest drop of the consecrated wine contains Jesus’ Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. When we are in Jesus’ presence we are respectful—properly dressed, quiet, not chewing gum or eating or drinking, and ever mindful of his presence. When we receive Holy Communion, we become tabernacles. We are now carrying Jesus within ourselves—thus the importance of being in a State of Grace. When the clergy or an extra-ordinary minister takes Holy Communion to someone in the pews, we again need to be mindful that they are carrying Jesus. If one of them comes into our path, either on our way to receive or on our way back to the pew, stop and wait until they have passed. So how do we behave in the presence of Jesus—ever respectful of our loving God. *Gay Snell*
