





What Does the Catholic Church Teach About....?

Question:

I was asked, "You mentioned minor exorcisms in regard to the Scrutiny Rites, does the Church still do Exorcisms??"

My Answer:

Firstly, let me define Exorcism as the driving out of or protection from the attack of Satan. We read in Scripture of Demon Possessions that Jesus Himself addresses by driving the demon out of people. We all may recall the book and movie, "The Exorcist". One scary piece of literature! Head spinning, green vomit, uncontrolled levitation and the like. Now that's possession! But, let's get real.

The Church has many minor exorcisms, the one we are most familiar with is that of Baptism. Through Baptism, the one being Baptized is brought into the protection of Christ Jesus Himself with the power of Grace to ward off the attack of Satan. Again, we see this at the time of Lent through the Scrutinies where the prayers, the beautiful prayers, we call upon God and the Faithful to pray for protection from Satan for the Catechumen, who will experience another exorcism at Baptism during the Easter Vigil.

Now the Big Question, what about the possession of an individual? Yes, the Church still holds that Demon Possession is a reality. There is great pain taken by the Church to explicitly confirm such possessions as authentic. There is an elaborate procedure that takes place for verification. Mental illness at one point in time was deemed possession, but the Church now looks deeper into a claim of possession.

If a claim of Demon Possession is verified, the Church, indeed, has a duly trained Exorcist available. Each Diocese is required have a trained qualified Exorcist ready to respond to a creditable Possession claim. The identity of the person is not known in order to keep from sensationalizing Exorcism.

There are explicit prayers and actions that must take place when addressing a possession. There is page after page of required prayers. There is a requirement of the Exorcist to be in a particular state of grace to battle the Devil. This is truly not for the light hearted. This is serious business and the Church takes it very seriously.

As I have stated before, even the minor exorcisms have great power over Satan. We all should listen to the words at Baptisms and at the Scrutinies. They are powerful.
