Why should I Forgive?

Forgiveness does more for us than it does for those whom we forgive. In Gal 3:22, our Lord tells us that this world is a prisoner of sin. The effects of The Original Sin are that humanity suffers the loss of The Holy Spirit and falls under the power of satan, who is filled with anger and hate. When people do evil to us and we respond with anger, then we become prisoners of that evil and satan has power over us. We stay locked up in the prison of resentment, bitterness, anger and hate, and then

we begin to do the work of the devil, speaking and acting out of anger, every time we think of the evil that was inflicted upon us. The person/s who did the evil to us has power over us, and we relive that evil over and over

and over until the day we die, OR, until the day that we choose to forgive.

Forgiveness is the key to freedom and peace. Forgiveness is arguably The Most Powerful Act and Revelation of God's Infinite Love. God's Love and Mercy frees from the power of the devil's anger and hate. God forgave us while we were yet enemies with Him by living in sin and doing evil to others. Living by Faith, means to live by what God told us. Jesus tells us in Mt 6:14 "For if you forgive men when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you." When you choose to forgive, then you choose to do what Jesus did. This is one of the ways that we become the Image and Likeness of God, Who is Love and Mercy Itself. When we choose NOT to be angry, and it is then that we can overcome the influence and power of satan's anger and hate to influence us. However, we are not able to forgive on our own. We can forgive only when we receive The Power of God's Love and Mercy through Jesus Christ. Jesus allows us to unite our sufferings to His, and to call up His Divine Love and Mercy so that we can do what He did from the Cross. Through Jesus, we can receive the strength to enable us to love our enemies and pray for our persecutors. By the Grace of God, we choose NOT to follow the wide and easy path of the devil's ways of anger and hate, but to follow that narrow and difficult path of Jesus' Ways in Love and Mercy by forgiving others.

Jesus forgave us when we asked Him. When we are sorry for our sins and go to that Sacrament of Confession, the evil of our sins is completely and totally forgiven by God's Gracious Mercy, even though we don't deserve it. Remember, the story of the unmerciful servant in Mt 18:21-35. He was forgiven a huge debt, but he refused to forgive others. Our Lord tells us that we will reap what we sow, in other words, forgive and you will be forgiven. Our Lord forgives us so that we can be at peace with God, but we must forgive others as we have been forgiven in order to be at peace with ourselves and others. Our peace, both now and eternally, depends on us forgiving others. In Mt 6:15, Jesus tells us: "But if you do not forgive men their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins." Forgiving others is absolutely necessary for us to be forgiven by God. Ask Jesus to help you forgive the people who have sinned against you. Jesus showed us what He did and what we are to do, even when the evil inflicted on us is so unjust and cruel. It does not matter whether they deserve to be forgiven or not. The evils of sin will test our Faith, Hope and Love, but when we believe, we do what Jesus says and what Jesus did, then we will find the power of God's Love within us to set us free from power of the devil and every evil desire. Love conquers all things and that is what Jesus is and what Jesus did on the Cross by resisting the power of the devil's anger and fury with His Love. God's Love gives us the freedom to have self-control (and)not to do everything that we feel like doing, especially, when we feel angry. Get free from the power of the devil's anger and hate, by choosing and using The Infinite Power of God's Divine Love and Mercy that is given to us by Jesus Christ to forgive one another as we have been forgiven.


