Divine Mercy Image and Divine Mercy Sunday:

The following are quotes from the book "Divine Mercy in My Soul Diary," by St. Faustina. The Catholic Church has since declared the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday.

Divine Mercy Image:



#47 "In the evening, when I was in my cell, I saw the Lord Jesus clothed in a white garment. One hand [was] raised in the gesture of blessing, the other was touching the garment at the breast. From beneath the garment, slightly drawn aside at the breast, there were emanating two large rays, one red, the other pale. In silence I kept my gaze fixed on the Lord; my soul was struck with awe, but also great joy. After a while, Jesus said to me, **'Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You. I desire that this image be venerated, first in your chapel, and [then] throughout the world.'** (Diary, 47)

#299 "When, on one occasion, my confessor told me to ask the Lord Jesus the meaning of the two rays in the image, I answered, 'Very well, I will ask the Lord.' During prayer I heard these words within me: **The two rays denote Blood and Water. The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls...** These two rays issued forth from the very depths of My tender mercy when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the Cross. The rays shield souls from the wrath of My Father. Happy is the one who will dwell in their shelter, for the just hand of God shall not lay hold of him. I desire that the first Sunday after Easter be the Feast of Mercy."

Divine Mercy Sunday:

#699 "On one occasion, I heard these words: **'My daughter, tell the whole world about My Inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come forth from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will I contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy.'**"

Some of the Promises for those who pray The Divine Mercy Chaplet:

#48 "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over [its] enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death. I Myself will defend it as My own glory." (Diary, 48).

#811 "When I entered my solitude, I heard these words: **At the hour of their death, I defend as My own glory every soul that will say this chaplet; or when others say it for a dying person, the indulgence is the same. When this chaplet is said by the bedside of a dying person, God's anger is placated, unfathomable mercy envelops the soul, and the very depths of My tender mercy are moved for the sake of the sorrowful Passion of My Son.**"

#1109 "I want to grant complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy."

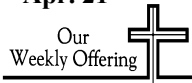
Stewardship Thought for the Week:

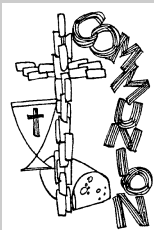

A Crucifix has been ordered from St. Jude Liturgical Art Studio. The corpus will be carved from linden wood in Italy by Pema woodcarvings and will be 74" high x 70" wide. A wider cross made of 2x6 wood (rather than 2x4) to fit the corpus and the sanctuary space will be made at the same time. The cost will be:

Corpus - \$14,870; Cross - \$1770; Shipping - \$1600; plus 6.5% sales tax. We have \$15,000 donated so far and some other people have expressed an interest in donating for a crucifix.

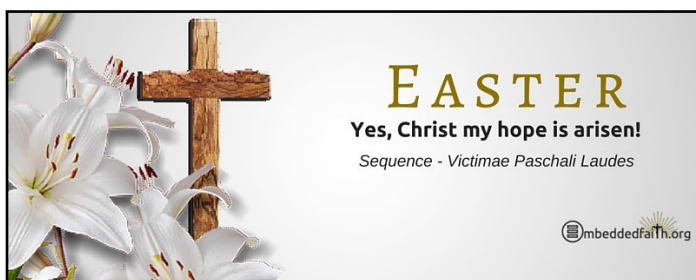
