Apostles Seminary in Connecticut, which is where I met some seminarians from the Sioux Falls diocese. I got along with those guys real well (which is a good part of the reason I sought to come here) but I prefer to tell people that in spite of them, and to spite them, I decided to apply to the Diocese of Sioux Falls! I am very grateful to Bishop Swain, the diocese of Sioux Falls, and most of all to the Lord for the second chance I've been given. Now I just hope now to "run the race to the finish" as St Paul says. I have been a priest for 6 years now, 2 as an associate at Sacred Heart in Aberdeen and 4 as pastor of Webster-Waubay.

I don't have any particular plan for any of the parishes. Ordination to priesthood confers three "offices" (or duties) onto the priest: priest (offer sacrifice / sanctify), prophet (speak on behalf of God — i.e., teach what He has revealed), and "king" (i.e., govern). My focus as a priest, then, is teaching the faith and celebrating the sacraments according to the rubrics (instructions) of the Church. I look forward to getting to know all of you and most of all to growing in faith with you. Please pray for me and be assured of my prayers for you. My name is Fr Kuhn, the new pastor of Colman, Elkton, and Flandreau. Changing pastors is always hard — for parishioners, staff, and priests as well. The only previous pastors of here that I know are the two most recent ones — Fr Doug and Fr Helmueller. I am grateful to follow in their footsteps. As you probably know, Fr Doug and I simply switched parishes

— he went to my previous parishes of Webster-Waubay. I'm sorry to say that Webster-Waubay are the ones who traded up. Nonetheless, it's my hope that, with the grace of God, we will continue to build on the foundation that these priests have laid.

Often times people like to know a little about the priest so I will try to accommodate that but it comes with a warning — I am the least interesting person I know, so it really is better if I talk mostly about our Lord. I suppose one thing is that I'm not actually from South Dakota. I grew up on a small family dairy farm in central Illinois (north-south wise) on the western edge, close to the Mississippi river, about 2 hours north of St Louis. I have 5 younger brothers, 1 older sister, and 1 younger sister. My mom is still living on our home place where I grew up. My youngest brother is also a priest. I like to point out, however, that I am the original Fr Kuhn — and no, he is not the new and improved! When I was still a seminarian I was back in IL visiting my family once and somebody told me it was 40 below in SD. I replied that I may have just fallen off the turnip truck, but not *that* truck! There's nowhere in the U.S that it gets that cold — maybe Antarctica but not in the U.S. Much to my chagrin, I came to realize I was mistaken on that particular point!

I'm sorry to say that I am what they call a "late vocation." When I was young (3rd or 4th grade) I knew I was supposed to be a priest and I held that conviction for many years. But by the time I got to high school, or at least through high school, I started chasing after other things. I never stopped going to Mass and I never rejected anything our Lord teaches through His Church but it wasn't until after college that I started to get more interested in the faith and the thought of priesthood returned. It started with running across two good Catholic books "by chance," then I started to look for more and more books, then daily Mass, rosary and other devotionals, frequent confession, a daily holy hour, and so on. Finally I knew I had to go and least try to carry out the Lord's will. I started at Holy (Cont. on page 4)


