# God is Omnipotent and Omniscience

St. Faustina had a vision: "On Friday, after Holy Communion, I was carried in spirit before the throne of God. There I saw the heavenly Powers which incessantly praise God. Beyond the throne I saw a brightness inaccessible to creatures, and there only the Incarnate Word enters as Mediator. When Jesus entered this light. I heard these words. Write down at once

what you hear: I am the Lord in My essence and am immune to orders or needs. If I call creatures into being—that is the abyss of My mercy. And at that very moment I found myself, as before, in our chapel at my kneeler, just as Mass had ended. I already had these words written." (Divine Mercy in My Soul, St. Faustina #85)

In this vision to St. Faustina, our Lord reminds us of some basic realities of God. He is Omnipotent. which means God is All Powerful. God is Omniscience, which means that He is all knowing. God makes no mistakes, and God expects us to do what He says. "If I call creatures into being—that is the abyss of My mercy." When God creates a human being, God intends for that human being to exist. Our Lord tells us "All things came to be through him, and without him nothing came to be." (John 1:3) "You shall not kill." (Ex. 20:13; Deut. 5:17) Thou shall not kill refers to NOT killing an innocent human being, which is murder. God is trying to protect us from the pain and suffering that comes from killing people. Faith is what God Says; Belief is when we do what God Says. When we hear God's Words, we are to believe and do what God Says.

Beware of people who do not do what God Says. The atheists do not believe in God, and the Christians who are living like atheists refuse to do what God Says, by saying that abortion is good. God says "woe to people who call evil good and good evil." (Is 5:20) These people are currently using every form of rhetoric to create fear and anger toward Christians, who are creating laws to stop the killing of abortion. These atheists understand that people do not like to be told what to do, so one of their tactics is to say: "Christians are imposing their belief on us." That statement is true, but their statement has two sides just like any coin. The atheists and Christians, who live like atheists, are imposing their belief that what God Says is evil, and they have the right to kill human beings through abortion. These people, who believe that killing is good, have little or no limits to their arbitrary reasons to kill human beings. Some states have already passed laws that not only allow the killing of abortion, but also to allow parents and doctors to kill their newly born baby. The killing of a baby outside the womb of the mother is infanticide, which is now legal in those states.

The Christians, who are doing what God says, are creating laws that make the killing of abortion illegal in order to protect and spare the mother and child from the evil effects of pain and suffering that come from killing.

Of these two groups, which do you want imposing their beliefs upon us as law? The people who believe they have the arbitrary right to the kill unwanted human beings, or the people who believe they have a God given right and obligation to respect and defend all human life?

God tells us what will happen to people who do evil things: "But as for cowards, the unfaithful, the deprayed, murderers, the unchaste, sorcerers, idol-worshippers, and deceivers of every sort, their lot is in the burning pool of fire and sulfur, which is the second death." (Rev 21:8) But God also tells us to "Repent and believe." (Mk

1:15) That means

stop doing evil and do what God says, which is to do good with love. "For God so loved the world(us) that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." (Jn 3:16) God has come to save repentant sinners, who will believe. But we must repent and believe before we will ask for God's Mercy. "For everyone who asks, receives; and to the one who seeks, finds; to the one who knocks, the door will be opened." (Mt 7:8) Divine Mercy will be given to all who repent and believe. That is what God Says. Just do it, and you will find peace. Fr. Doug Binsfeld




