God Calls us to "Face Today with Me":

"Our Lord and our God. Make us all Thou wouldst have us.

It is not circumstances that need altering first, but yourselves, and then the conditions will naturally alter. Spare no effort to become all I would have you. Follow every leading. I am your only Guide.

Endeavor to put from you every thought of trouble. Take each day, and with no backward look, face the day's problem with Me, and seek My Help and guidance as to what you can do.

Never look back and never leave until the morrow that on which you can get My Guidance for today." (God Calling, June 14th)

Our Lord is always seeking our conversion, which is our 'yes' to God. Just as Mary's 'fiat'(yes) to God, when she said "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." (Lk 1:38) Easy words to say, not so easy to do. Our Lord tells us "(8) My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways. (9) For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways above your ways, and my thoughts higher than your thoughts." (Is 55:8-9) This is the difficulty of conversion to God, as we turn from our sinful thoughts and ways to God's Holy Thoughts and Ways. It is not the circumstances and situations of life that need to change; but we need to change. Our prideful attitude needs to change in the way we respond to the situations and circumstances in life. In our pride we want things "my way", and when it is not "my way", then we get pouty, impatient, upset and angry. Whose thoughts are those thoughts, and whose ways are those ways? They are not The Lord's, as our Lord is always loving and forgiving. Jesus came to serve and not to be served. Jesus always accepted The Will of The Father and never got angry or upset about The Cross. The apostle Paul tells us what Jesus told Him: "We know that all things work for good for those who love God, who are called to his purpose." (Rom 8:28) God's Purpose is His Plan for your Salvation. God created you to be Holy so that you can be saved. Saved from what? Saved from the devil. Remember, what our Lord tells us about this world, "Now before faith came, we were confined under the law, kept under restraint until faith should be revealed." (Gal 3:23) "Being confined" and "under restraint" means that the world is a prison of sin with evil all around us. Faith is what God Says; It is God's Thoughts and Ways and if we do it then we become free from the powerful temptations of the devil, and we can do far better than Adam and Eve. After the original sin, The Holy Spirit departed from humanity, and they no longer had The Strength, Knowledge, Wisdom and Love of God that was originally given to them to resist the devil and stay in a Holy State of Life with God. Before the Original Sin, satan could only tempt Adam and Eve. After they listened and did what the devil told them, they became slaves of the devil. "Do you not know that when you present yourselves to someone as obedient slaves, you are slaves to the one you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness?" (Rom 6:16) When we sin, we do the evil desire that the devil tempts us with, and we are slaves of the devil, who leads us to hell. When we practice our Faith in Jesus Christ, we do what God Says, and we are slaves of God, Who leads us to Heaven. The Good Fight is when we resist the devil who tempts us with evil desire. When we know what God Says, we make the choice to refuse temptations with the strength, knowledge and wisdom that come from God to give us self -control. Paul says, "I have competed well; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith." (2 Tim 4:7) Paul resisted all the evils of sin, he did good with love, he forgave those who hurt him and he spoke God's Words with Love. Resisting evil is the "fight"; It is the "race". Compete well, means to keep your eyes (mind) fixed on Jesus, by remembering what Jesus Says and doing it. As we go through difficulties and hardships of life, we often fail to understand how God is doing good to us when evil is happening to us. This is why we need the Crucifix to remind us that evil stopped with Jesus, because Jesus chose NOT to respond with evil. Jesus responded with perfect Faith, Hope and Love when evil was done to Him. This is how we defeat the devil's many temptations and attacks to make us anxious, afraid and angry. This is how we go from Glory to Glory as Jesus did, by choosing to respond to others with Love. The devil hates us and wants to abuse us and do violence to us. Jesus Loves us and wants to show His Love to us, and will show His Love to us, if only we will turn to Him and believe as we suffer.
