The Sacred Heart of Jesus:

Last Friday we celebrated the feast of The Sacred Heart of Jesus, which reveals God opening His Divine Life of Love to us. St. Margaret Mary Alacoque was a pure and Holy soul, who saw many apparitions of Jesus, but she had the "Great Apparition" on June 16, 1675 when Jesus revealed His Heart surrounded by thorns and burning with fire. Jesus told her "that the flames represented His love for humanity. and the thorns represented man's sinfulness and ingratitude." ... Jesus told her ... "to request that the Feast of the Sacred Heart be celebrated on the Friday after the octave (or eighth day) of the Feast of Corpus Christi, in reparation for the ingratitude of men for the sacrifice that Christ had made for them." It is in Jesus that we see the depths of True Love. Jesus is always knocking at the door of our hearts, "(20) Behold, I stand at the door

and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, [then] I will enter his house and dine with him, and he with me. (21) I will give the victor the right to sit with me on my throne, as I myself first won the victory and sit with my Father on his throne." (Rev 3:20-21) When we listen to what Jesus Says and do it, the door of our hearts is opened, and we let Jesus into our lives. This openness occurs only when we make a free will choice to accept God's Ways and do it by using the intelligence that God has given to us. We become what we believe.

Infinite Love is indescribable in human words. Even the most articulate and eloquent words used to describe God's Infinite Love pale to The Reality of what they attempt to describe. This is why God gives us images to remind us of His Divine Love. Love is experienced, but what do we love? There is True Love and there is apparent love that is seriously misguided. True Love can move us to heroic and noble acts of extraordinary self-giving love that we see in Jesus, Who laid down His Divine Life of Love for all who will repent and believe. But, not all will repent and believe as they love what is futile and seek what is false. This is apparent love. They love the things of this world because they love themselves and anything that benefits them in this life. This is why people lie, cheat, steal, kill, commit adultery, fornication, homosexuality. Motivations of apparent love(*self-love*) are pride, greed, jealousy, lust, anger, hate and rage. People like this generally do not oppose other people who do the evil that they do, but they accuse everyone else of doing the evil that they do. Jesus calls such people "a den of thieves", because they make what is Holy, unholy by doing unholy things. God created all people to be Holy, but people choose to be unholy by doing evil things.

God created us to be His Image and Likeness. (Gn 1:27) Jesus came to set us free from the oppressive power of the devil's evil desire that influences us. Jesus reveals The Truths of God The Father with perfect Love, and Jesus shows us The Truth of God's Love in all His actions as He drives the devil out of people, heals physical diseases, walks on water, calms storms, raises the dead to new life. Jesus can show us True Love because Jesus is True Love. Jesus became a man, when humanity was still an enemy with God. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. (Jn 3:16) This is why Jesus tells us "be perfect as your Heavenly Father is perfect." (Mt 5:48) This means to be Holy and not to do evil. Jesus tells us and shows us that we are NOT to respond with evil, even when evil is done to us: "(44) But I say to you, love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you," (Mt 5:44) Jesus does this from the Cross as He does NOT become angry at those who falsely accuse Him, abuse Him, condemn Him and do horrific violence to Him. Jesus forgives them and us. This is The New Way! A New Way to be human by responding with Love to the people of evil desire who attack us. Jesus is The Way and The Truth and The Life. (Jn 14:6) If we choose The Ways of Jesus, then we let Jesus into our hearts and find Jesus within us through The Grace and Power of The Holy Spirit; We gain self-control to repent of evil and do good (Continued on page 2)
