Divine Mercy Sunday Continuation:

The following paragraph is when Jesus spoke to St. Faustina in regards to Mercy.

"But write this for many souls who are often worried because they do not have the material means with which to carry out an act of mercy. Yet spiritual mercy, which requires neither permissions or storehouses, is much more meritorious and is within

the grasp of every soul. If a soul does not exercise mercy somehow or other, it will not obtain My mercy on the day of judgment. Oh, if only souls knew how to gather eternal treasures for themselves, they would not be judged, for they would forestall My judgment with their mercy."

(paragraph #1317, Diary of Saint Faustina).



The following paragraph is St. Faustina speaking of how we can show God's Merciful Love and receive the merits and privileges as members of the body of Christ.

"Everyone in the world can belong to this group. A member of this group ought to perform at least one act of mercy a day; at least one, but there can be many more, for such deeds can easily be carried out by anyone, even the very poorest. For there are three ways of performing an act of mercy: the merciful word, by forgiving and by comforting; secondly, if you can offer no word, then pray—that too is mercy; and thirdly, deeds of mercy. And when the Last Day comes, we shall be judged from this, and on this basis we shall receive the eternal verdict." (paragraph #1158, Diary of Saint Faustina).

In the first paragraph, our Lord Jesus reminds us that every person can and should show mercy every day. Mercy is a part of love, and God's Love is freely given and we are to give it freely. It is available and limitless to all people, who are willing to give it. The only limitations to giving God's Love in this world is us. We have been given free will to do as we please, and I pray that we will be pleased to do God's Will all the days of our lives. If you find that you don't have enough love to make the sacrifices to show mercy to others, then ask Jesus to give you more of His Life of Love until you have enough love in your soul to show God's Tender Compassion to people, especially, the people who have hurt or offended you because your salvation depends on it. "If you forgive others their transgressions, your heavenly Father will forgive you. (15) But if you do not forgive others, neither will your Father forgive your transgressions." (Mt 6:14-15).

Pray that you can love Jesus above all things, so that nothing blocks The Divine Love that God wants to bestow upon you, so that, you may give God's Love to people. Seek our Lord Jesus by receiving Him in The Sacraments, and you will find a greater store of God's Love within your soul so that you may do the good that Jesus did. Receiving and giving God's Mercy changes our will and desire, and we are renewed, transformed and transfigured more and more into The Image and Likeness of our God. That is what conversion is all about!!! "Neither graces, nor revelations, nor raptures, nor gifts granted to a soul make it perfect, but rather the intimate union of the soul with God. These gifts are merely ornaments of the soul, but constitute neither its essence nor its perfection. My sanctity and perfection consist in the close union of my will with the will of God." (Diary, para. #1107) A close relationship with Jesus will enable you to love others, including your enemies and persecutors. You will be able to love yourself in healthy and appropriate ways, while avoiding the prideful arrogance of greed, cynicism, and self-righteousness that come from excessive self love. We can become fully Christian, which is to be like Jesus Christ. Allow your mind and will to be more fully united with God's Mind and Will, by reading scriptures to know what God does, by keeping God's 10 Commandments which will reform and change our disordered human ways of thoughts, words, and actions into God's Ways of Thoughts, Words and Actions. Through perseverance in prayer, worship and receiving Jesus in The Sacraments, "be perfect, just as your Heavenly Father is perfect." (Mt 5:48) "For human beings this is impossible, but not for God. All things are possible for God" (Mk 10:27), and you will find Peace in your Soul, because God will dwell within your soul and you become a Temple of the Holy Spirit. Repeat Jesus' Words on the Divine Mercy Image, "Jesus I trust in you." Trusting in God's Infinite Love and Mercy, gives us repentant sinners Great Hope! May God Bless you. Fr. Doug Binsfeld
