### MESSAGE FROM ARCHBISHOP KURTZ COVID-19 UPDATE

Archbishop Kurtz is restoring the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation effective the weekend of September 4-5, 2021. Archbishop Kurtz will include a message to parishioners about this development in the September 2 issue of The Record, and we encourage your review of his reflections and insights about the centrality of the Holy Eucharist in our lives as Those parishioners who Catholics. are immunocompromised, or have severe fears or anxiety as well as those who care for those who are ill are always exempt from this obligation. (See Catechism of the Catholic Church #2181). Parishioners also may exercise prudent caution about Mass attendance for those who cannot be vaccinated, such as children under the age of 12. Please be in touch with the parish if you have any specific questions about this obligation.

Archbishop Kurtz requires masks for Masses and other indoor parish activities for those who are not yet vaccinated against COVID-19, especially during this time of high transmission of the Delta variant. Masks also are required by students, faculty, staff, and visitors in all school settings, including school Masses, and for any parish programming involving children who are unable to be vaccinated, such as parish religious education programs. Archbishop Kurtz also strongly encourages those who are eligible to get the vaccination if they have not done so already.




#### **GIVING OPPORTUNITIES**

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Have you ever felt nervous in standing up for something, or in taking a position on an issue? Even when the stakes are not particularly high, like a classroom debate over an author's meaning in her text or requesting that customer service fix a take-out order gone awry, it can be nerve-wracking for many of us to have this kind of engagement. It is especially difficult when we sense conflict. Why is that? Why do we care so much what others think of us? What about when the stakes are literally life or death? In today's first reading, Joshua is imploring the people to decide which god they will serve, and he boldly proclaims: "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." In the Gospel, some of Jesus' disciples reject his teachings and drift back to "their former way of life." Jesus asks the Twelve whether they, too, "want to leave." Simon Peter responds with the rhetorical question, "Master, to whom [else] shall we go?" Like Joshua, he is bold in his own pronouncement: "You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God." Today's readings encourage and exhort us to go "all in" when it comes to discipleship. The implication is clear; it matters not what others think of us, or what attraction they might hold for us to acquiesce to them. God alone is the source of life, and the truth. He offers us a way - it's that simple. We simply must decide to serve him.

#### GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

At times this commitment, this life of discipleship, is more difficult than other times. Faith is a personal and communal relationship with our Triune God, and just like our human relationships it requires attentiveness, and "[living] in love as Christ loved us." Just as a spouse or roommate can annoy us - being messy, hearing the same joke over and over, and don't get me started on who gets to control the remote! - we may get upset with God because our expectations are not met. But God is God, not "who we think God ought to be." Therefore, today's readings are an encouragement to remain steadfast when things are difficult, with St. Paul comparing the love of Jesus for the Church (all of us!) with the mutual love between a husband and wife. No one said it would be easy. Just as a good marriage requires communication, give-and-take, and large doses of forgiveness, so does our relationship with the Lord require prayer, confession, repentance, and thanksgiving.

**ACTION** Place Joshua's words on your refrigerator this week: "Decide today whom you will serve ... As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." Brainstorm about how each member of your household can do that.

## CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD CLOW FAO

#### What is CLOW?

The word "Liturgy" is part of its name for a reason. CLOW is actually an extension of the Mass. Children who participate in CLOW are guided through the Liturgy of the Word in the same manner that we partake of it in the Mass. They learn and follow all prayer responses and postures. After the readings, they listen to the leader who will guide them through an age appropriate activity or lesson that is based on the readings. This process is the child's "homily." After this the children say or echo back an adapted Creed and offer their prayers of petition before returning to Mass.

### What ages of children can attend CLOW?

Our CLOW program is provided for and geared to children **ages 3-1st grade**. Second grade and above children are asked to stay in the Mass with parents. Children who are preparing for First Sacraments are especially encouraged to stay and partake in the regular Mass as part of their ongoing learning and preparation for sacraments.

### When will CLOW return?

Hopefully, we will be able to start in late September or early October. To be able to start we need commitments from at least 3-4 more adults (18 and above) who will rotate and lead one Sunday every 4-6 weeks. We also need one extra adult with them so that we meet all Safe Environment guidelines for our Archdiocese. Thus, we are looking for a team of 8-10 adults. All adults must have taken the safe environment class from the Archdiocese and have a current background check processed through the Archdiocese of Louisville. CLOW leaders will attend a very brief training (date to be announced). Please email or contact Cyndi in the parish office -cmarlow@stbernardlou.com or 239-5178 ext. 125.

### Can other children or youth help during CLOW?

Typically, we do not need much help during a session. Too many older children can actually end up causing more distraction than help. One or two **seventh grade and above** youth only are welcome to come back to assist the leaders.


