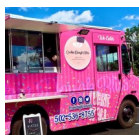

## GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

I don't know about you, but even for the quickest of errands I don't like to leave my house without my smartphone. Nor would I go on a road trip without my trusty mini-Diet Coke and a snack or two. So I'm struck by what Jesus tells the Apostles when he sends them on their mission to share the Good News: "He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick - no food, no sack, no money in their belts." While it may be hard for us to imagine striking out with only the sandals on our feet, to me this reading is more about what the Apostles *did* have than what they went without: They had a companion (Jesus sent them two by two) and the spiritual blessings Saint Paul refers to, including a relationship with Jesus and absolute trust in him. Today's readings remind us to set aside distractions and spend time deepening our relationship with Jesus through prayer, reading the Scriptures, and participating in the sacramental life of the Church. In doing so, we, too, can join in the mission of the early disciples by giving our lives to Jesus and sharing his message with others.

**WITNESS** At the end of Sunday Mass, we often hear the words: "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life." As we are sent forth, let us ask God to show us how we can share the Gospel with others during the week ahead. Then pay attention to where the Spirit leads us in answering our prayer.

## GO EVANGELIZE

### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

I find the phrase "the new evangelization" somewhat ironic. After all, evangelization is not new, it goes back to the earliest days of the Church, which wouldn't exist had it not been for the disciples. The "new" part reminds us that we today also share in this mission. The U.S. Catholic bishops describe it succinctly: "The New Evangelization calls each of us to deepen our faith, believe in the Gospel message and go forth to proclaim the Gospel." This call is both simple, and challenging, but we don't have to be perfect. After all, just as God called Amos, a humble shepherd, and Jesus called the Twelve, a motley group of fishermen, he calls us. Like them, our first "task" isn't a task at all - it is placing God and our relationship with Jesus at the center of our lives. Only then can we effectively share the Gospel with others, inviting our brothers and sisters to a life in Christ - to become part of God's adopted family.

## THE NEXT SCHEDULED BAPTISM WEEKEND AUGUST 7/8

## IS GOD CALLING YOU TO BE A CATECHIST?

St Bernard has opportunities for YOU to share God's love with the children of our parish! Catechists/co-catechists and assistants are urgently needed in our parish Religious Education program for grades K-8.

### What is a Catechist?

A catechist is a teacher of our faith. As a catechist or co-catechist, you will help our children elementary and middle school ages to understand and learn about Jesus, his Church and being and living Catholic.

### When are classes?

Our program is offered 2 times a month basically every other week on Sundays between the Masses. There are roughly 16 classes from September-May.

### Will I have any help or support?

ABSOLUTELY!! You will have support from parish staff as well as other experienced volunteers. Our goal is two catechists for each class; one as the lead and the other as the support catechist. All Catechists are supplied with a teacher's edition which explains step by step what to cover in class. As a catechist, you will discover that your own knowledge of the faith, prayer, liturgy and your own relationship with God will become more vibrant and meaningful.

### How much of a time commitment is it?

The time spent as a catechist depends on many factors; class sessions are 60 minutes; there will also be some limited home preparations needed.

## CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD TEAM NEEDED

Are you and your children missing Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW)? If you have answered yes, then please consider joining the CLOW team. As a reminder, CLOW is the process where children ages 3-7 are dismissed from Mass at the start of the readings and are taken to hear the Scripture proclaimed at an age appropriate level. Children are returned to Mass immediately after the petitions. CLOW is offered during the months of Sept/Oct - early May during the 11:00 a.m. Mass. It takes a core group of volunteers to be able to offer this ministry. We are looking for volunteers to lead sessions each week and a volunteer coordinator who, with the help of our Faith Formation Coordinator, will oversee the program and the scheduling of volunteers. A team of 6-8 people will help us be able to resume this ministry. Do you have a child/grandchild grades K - 8 that does not attend Catholic School? Are you a Catholic School family that wants to dive in and explore your faith together? We have a program for you. 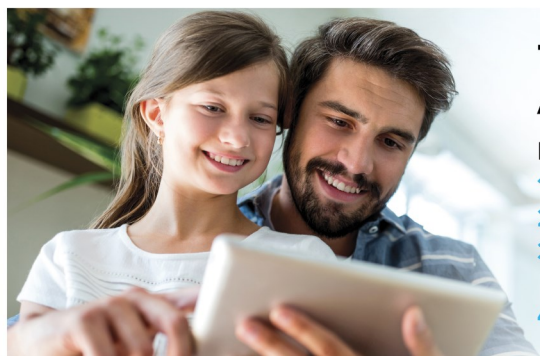
## Reconciliation
