GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

I once saw Tony Melendez, a musician born without arms, play his guitar for the pope - with his feet - and I knew I had witnessed something exceptional, something extraordinary. We may be feeling the same way about some of the Olympic performances taking place right now. But however amazed Tony Melendez or an Olympic medal performance might make us feel, it is hard to imagine what it must have been like to experience Jesus taking a few barley loaves and fish, blessing them, and somehow feeding more than 5,000 people. How Great Thou Art, indeed! Participating in this miracle was lifechanging for those who realized what Jesus had done. They were convinced, on the spot, that Jesus was a prophet, and were ready to carry him away as a king. But Jesus did not come to be an earthly king, he came to give his life for us, that we might have life with him in abundance.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

One boy gives up his lunch and Jesus feeds thousands - and there were twelve wicker baskets with fragments left over! Think of how God can multiply our gifts. Perhaps there are times we fail to share what we have, thinking it is too small to make a difference; thinking that what we bring to feed others can't possibly be worth anything. Sure, what usually happens with us isn't on a scale like today's Gospel passage, and our offering may not be "Olympic" in nature. But in sharing our gifts as Jesus calls us to to love our neighbor and to do "small things with great love" as St. Teresa of Calcutta is purported to have said - there is no such thing as a gift or talent too small. Ask the Holy Spirit for fortitude as you strive to share your gifts.

ACTION Perhaps it's time to contact someone who has been on your mind lately. A seemingly small gesture of concern may be just the support they need right now. With the help of the Holy Spirit, perhaps you may be a source of affirmation for them, providing a catalyst that helps them discern their path more clearly.

THE NEXT SCHEDULED BAPTISM WEEKEND AUGUST 7/8

The next Rite of Infant Baptism (children ages 0 - 7) is scheduled for August 7/8. This will be the last one before the start of the school year. Baptism is our entry into the family of God. It is the first of the Sacraments of Initiation and is required prior to moving forward to celebrate the other sacraments. Catholic Families in our school or parish who are looking to have a child prepare for the celebration of First Sacraments (Reconciliation and Eucharist) must have the child before beginning preparation sacraments. St. Bernard will be hosting a Red Cross Blood Drive on Monday, July 26, 4:00-8:00 p.m. Help save a life by donating blood.




FRANCISCAN SHELTER

Are you looking for a meaningful way to put your faith in action? Would you enjoy the rewards of seeing people receive a meal that they may not be able to afford because of difficult circumstances in their life?

Then consider volunteering for the area's longest continually serving soup kitchen, the Franciscan Kitchen at 748 S. Preston St. in Louisville, as a cook, kitchen prep worker, or food server. During serving time of 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., about 400 meals are served. To comply with health protocols, take-out meals are given.

If you have worked as a cook, or just enjoy the experience of getting a meal together, your service will be greatly appreciated. Cooks report at 6:00 a.m. to get things started and depart around noon. Prep workers arrive at 7:00 a.m. and remain until 10:30 a.m. Servers come in at 9:45 a.m. and stay until 12:45 to close and clean up.

Signing up to volunteer is easy - The Kitchen uses SignUp Genius website to schedule workers - it is easily accessed from the organization's website, www.franciscankitchen.org. IS GOD CALLING YOU TO BE A CATECHIST?

St Bernard has opportunities for YOU to share God's love with the children of our parish! Catechists/co-catechists and assistants are urgently needed in our parish Religious Education program for grades K-8.

What is a Catechist?

A catechist is a teacher of our faith. As a catechist or cocatechist, you will help our children elementary and middle school ages to understand and learn about Jesus, his Church and being and living Catholic.

When are classes?

Our program is offered 2 times a month basically every other week on Sundays between the Masses. There are roughly 16 classes from September-May.

Will I have any help or support?

ABSOLUTELY!! You will have support from parish staff as well as other experienced volunteers. Our goal is two catechists for each class; one as the lead and the other as the support catechist. All Catechists are supplied with a teacher's edition which explains step by step what to cover in class. As a catechist, you will discover that your own knowledge of the faith, prayer, liturgy and your own relationship with God will become more vibrant and meaningful.

How much of a time commitment is it?

The time spent as a catechist depends on many factors; class sessions are 60 minutes; there will also be some limited home preparations needed.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD TEAM NEEDED

Are you and your children missing Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW)? If you have answered yes, then please consider joining the CLOW team. As a reminder, CLOW is the process where children ages 3-7 are dismissed from Mass at the start of the readings and are taken to hear the Scripture proclaimed at an age appropriate level. Children are returned to Mass immediately after the petitions. CLOW is offered during the months of Sept/Oct - early May during the 11:00 a.m. Mass. It takes a core group of volunteers to be able to offer this ministry. We are looking for volunteers to lead sessions each week and a volunteer coordinator who, with the help of our Faith Formation Coordinator, will oversee the program and the scheduling of volunteers.
