1ST QUARTER 2021-2022 FINANCIAL STATEMENT NOTES

Income for the first quarter is up \$272,824 as compared to the same time last year due to:

- Tuition has come in at a faster rate than last year due to more people paying in full and having a greater student population (increase of approximately 20 students)
- The preschool has received two grant payments totaling \$83,200
- With activities resuming after being largely shut down from covid last year income from auxiliary and program revenues is up \$72,762

Expenses for the first quarter are up \$152,547 due to:

- Total payroll and benefit expenses are up \$29,417-this is not unexpected as some new positions were added during the budgeting process as well as 2% raises being given
- Plant and grounds expenses are up \$62,683; part of this is due to utility and other expenses rising as we bring the campus back to life whereas it was largely shut down at this time last year and the large amount of expenses to keep our HVAC systems running. Between March 1 and September 30 of this year, well in excess of \$30,000 has been spent on repairs to keep the various systems running
- As with the income, auxiliary and program expenses are up as activities come back to normal

Net income is up \$120,277 as compared to the first quarter of last year

Areas of concern:

- Collections are down \$10,590 (\$7,445 of this is due to the elimination of the GE Matching Gifts program) but the decrease is something that will bear monitoring going forward.
- As mentioned above, HVAC repairs have been extremely high. It is our hope based on having a successful capital campaign to have the various systems replaced next summer. This area is one that will definitely be over budget for the current year.

Balance Sheet Notes:

- The parish cash position remains strong
- The loan to the Archdiocese has been paid off
