Approve Agenda: Steve made a motion to approve the agenda, Ron seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously 3. Old Business • Update on parapet walls - Steve updated -Warren at Andrews Tuckpointing has ordered the block and will start after he finishes his current job. It will take 2 to 3 weeks. He will also coordinate with the contractors from Elevate to check out the leak when he removes the brick, they both will assess the damage for us. • Gutter above west church door – Dave removed leaves that were blocking, now we need to keep an eye on it to see if that was the problem. We will have Elevate assess this also when they are here. • Power wash the hall siding and front retaining wall – Dean has completed the hall siding, it looks great and we are still looking on how to get water and power washer to the front wall. Ron may have some spray that may work. 4. New Business • Stairs – back door of office needs some work – we will look into ideas on how to revamp them. • Wifi in the church – this is a need to continue to have Live Streaming Masses. Ron will see if he can get some conduit bored under the sidewalk. Brian Dotzler will help get this completed. He has been helping with the weekly masses. • Bell update – The church bells were not working. Dean coordinated everything to have the company come out and get them working for us. Both bells now ring at noon and 5:30 P.M. If you haven't notice, please listen as they sound really nice now. Interesting Note: The original people that donated the money for the bells all have their names engraved on the bells. In turn the parish gave each donor a free plot in the cemetery. • Insurance claim on church – Catholic Mutual was out and inspected the structural soundness of the church. The findings stated there where no damages due to the explosion in town. Fr. Dan has been in communication with the insurance company and will continue to work with them on this. • West windows over balcony – The lead is coming loose from the windows and these will need replaced. We have received to bins on the replacement. One bid \$11,650 and the other bid \$43,000. Quite a big difference in price. In some point in time, all the leading will need replaced. There will be further discussion on this topic. Cristie will check with Woodbine to see who replaced their windows and if they have been pleased with the work. 5.
