that have their own distinctive character, there remains in the yearly cycle thirty-three or thirty-four weeks in which no particular aspect of the mystery of Christ is celebrated, but rather the mystery of Christ itself is honored in its fullness, especially on Sundays. This period is known as Ordinary Time". Ordinary time begins on Mon., Jan. 13, and continues through Tues., Feb. 25, the day before Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the Lenten season. It will resume when the Easter season ends, that is on Monday, Jun 1, the day following Pentecost.

## 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time -

The life of a disciple calls for repentance and courage. Jesus fulfils all prophecy and brings light to our darkness. He calls his disciples out of their way of life - from fishermen to fishers of men. He calls us to follow him, too, so as to bring light, truth and goodness into a world that needs repentance.

In the first reading, Isaiah writes of the day when all gloom is gone. Light will come to the people who walked in darkness, and they will rejoice. Saint Paul urges the Corinthians to have no divisions

among [them]. In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus, walking by the Sea of Galilee, calls Simon, Andrew, James and John to follow him. The brothers leave everything and follow Jesus.

## RESPECT LIFE APPEAL THIS WEEKEND'S SECOND COLLECTION

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

Since 1973, every January the Church focuses our attention on the United States Supreme Court's horrific decision in *Roe v Wade* that a woman has a constitutional right to abort the innocent child in her womb and now, even during the child's birth.

Later this spring, the Church will mark the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of *Evangelium vitae* (*The Gospel of Life*). In that landmark encyclical, Pope St. John Paul II provides a clear challenge to us: "With great openness and courage, we need to question how widespread is the culture of life today among individual Christians, families, groups and communities in our dioceses? With equal clarity and determination, we must identify the steps we are called to take in order to serve life in all its truth" (*EV*, 95).

Here in the Diocese of Ogdensburg, Colleen and John Miner, Directors of our Diocesan Respect Life Office, coordinate our efforts to take the steps we need to serve life in all its truth in the North Country. We work to build a culture of life in a society that far too often demeans, devalues and destroys life. At our Masses today, we are given the opportunity to support the steps we have identified "to serve life in all its truth" by contributing to the annual *Respect Life Collection*. Monies donated to this collection provide grants for our Respect Life efforts.

Grants in 2019 enabled more of our youth and college students to attend the *March for Life* in Washington, where young North Country pilgrims marched with fellow prolifers from across our nation, in opposition to the sinful stain of abortion. Several grants aided parish *Project Gabriel* programs. The "angels" of *Project Gabriel* lend a compassionate ear to struggling new mothers, material assistance to care for their newborn child and a variety of other supports. Respect Life grants assisted *Birthright* of Plattsburgh, an interdenominational organization helping women with unplanned pregnancies. Other grants supported educational programs, Catholic radio in the Adirondacks and various pro-life programs.

Thank you for your prayers and generous support of the 2020 Respect Life Collection and for all your efforts to build a culture of life by changing hearts and minds.

#### The Common Call

This Gospel passage (Matthew 4:12-23) recounts the call of the first disciples. They may not have known Jesus personally at first, but they knew about him through John the Baptist (John 1:35 - 42). When invited to know Jesus better and follow him closely; the men dropped what they were doing "at once" and left everything behind.

Under Christ's leadership, the disciples went on to do amazing things. They worked miracles, brought the Gospel to distant lands, converted countless souls for heaven, and suffered hardships, even martyrdom. The secret of their success was their relationship with Christ as their God, Savior, Teacher, and Friend who promised to be with them always (Matthew 28:20).

All of us are called to be saints - intimate friends of God. Jesus invites each of us to know him personally and follow him closely. While few of us are called to leave everything, we can still offer everything we have to God's service. We can still imitate the first disciples who dropped everything "at once" to accept God's invi-

tation. Knowing Jesus personally and closely makes for a great adventure.
