

#### LIVE LENT - TIME IS RUNNING OUT!

Lent begins in about 10 days, so the time to join a small faith sharing group is running out. Are you still trying to figure out what it is all about? Are you wondering if you have the time?

#### Well here are three more reasons to join Live Lent:

- 1. The small faith sharing community is a great place to learn. There is no judgment in the group so there is no fear of asking questions. Everyone is there by choice which seems to set a tone of openness, and everyone is there because they are seeking and likely seeking different things. people may join because they are new and want to meet people; people may join because they don't think they know enough about their faith but they don't have anyone to talk with about faith "stuff;" others say the join because they want to "figure out God" which at first seems like a tall order but the reality is for most people they once again find God alive in their lives.
- 2. Your small group will be a great place to relax . . . life runs on a very fast and busy cycle. Finding a place to slow down and relax can be hard. But your small group is just that place. The leader usually begins by asking for a few minutes of quiet, to settle ourselves and let go of the day . . . what an amazing grace that is! Sitting quietly, a few deep breaths and everything slows down.
- 3. Your small group will help anchor you. During those 90 minutes, you are focused on the scripture readings, on the reflections that are shared both in the stories in the book and the sharing of group members and the life discussions that come from sharing. The session ends with a challenge to identify an action for the upcoming week that will keep you anchored in the spirit of the program. You will be amazed how quickly your faith becomes more apparent in your day-to-day life.

So what are you waiting for? This extraordinary program allows friendships to begin and grow, encourages deep and meaningful prayer, and brings participants to a deeper faith and a more authentic relationship with our loving God. So why wouldn't you Live Lent?

#### A MESSAGE FROM FR MICHAEL

Over the past couple of weeks a few parishioners have suggested I put in the bulletin the announcement of my moving on from Saint Anthony and St Mary parishes. The folks mentioned they were away the weekend of January 11th & 12th, when I made the announcement, and know others were too. I am grateful for the suggestion. Below is the text of my announcement.

As most of you know, I have been a priest for 31+ years. In all of my assignments over those years, my goal has been to serve God well by being of best service to the people of my assignments. Over the past many weeks I have been reflecting on whether I am the right priest to pastor and be of best service to our parishes and Collaborative. After much prayer and discernment I believe that the people of our parishes would be best served by a priest with a different skill set than I have. While there are several reasons that have guided me to this conclusion, one is that I believe - at this point in the development of the parishes and Collaborative - the parishes would be best served by a pastor who will be involved in the small details of the daily operations of each of our parishes.

It is with great pleasure that I share with you that Cardinal Sean is appointing Fr Scott Euvard as the new pastor of Saint Anthony Parish and Saint Mary Parish, effective February 24, 2020. I know Fr Scott. He is a great pastor who has been successfully leading the Living Water Catholic collaborative in Amesbury/Salisbury for the past six years.

Permit me this opportunity to thank you all for the support that you have given me over these past months. I am most grateful and will keep you all, and the success of Christ By the Sea Collaborative, held in prayer. It has been an honor getting to know you, the 200+ parishioners I have met during the Tuesday Conversations with Father Michael, and praying Holy Mass together daily and on the weekends. You will always have a special place in my memory, and I look forward to hearing about the great things that will happen in each parish in the years to come.

#### From Fr. Scott: My Key Responsibility Areas Part II

Last weekend I shared with you my belief that, with the ongoing decline in the number of priests available for assignment in the Archdiocese of Boston and the resulting increase in responsibilities for priests, often based on outdated expectations, it is important for me to focus on my key responsibility areas. I shared with you two of my key responsibility areas. Today I share two more with you. These are like beacons of light during ministry. When deciding how to spend my time and energy, I look to these key responsibility areas. Though I may bear ultimate responsibility for all that happens in the parishes, if what is being expected of me does not fit into one of my key responsibility areas, then proximate responsibility for it needs to be shifted to a staff member or lay leader. Key responsibility areas numbers three and four:

- Proclaim, teach, and promote the Word of God, the Catholic faith, and gospel-based works, so that all entrusted to my pastoral care will hear the Word of God, know the Catholic faith, and practice gospel-based works.
- Create and review parish communications (print, web, social media) so that all parish communications express invitation and welcome as they communicate our faith.

As we move forward, please join me in turning to Jesus Christ in prayer for all impacted by this upcoming transition the parishioners and staff members of the Catholic parishes in Amesbury and Salisbury and Cohasset and Hull, Father Michael, and me.
