

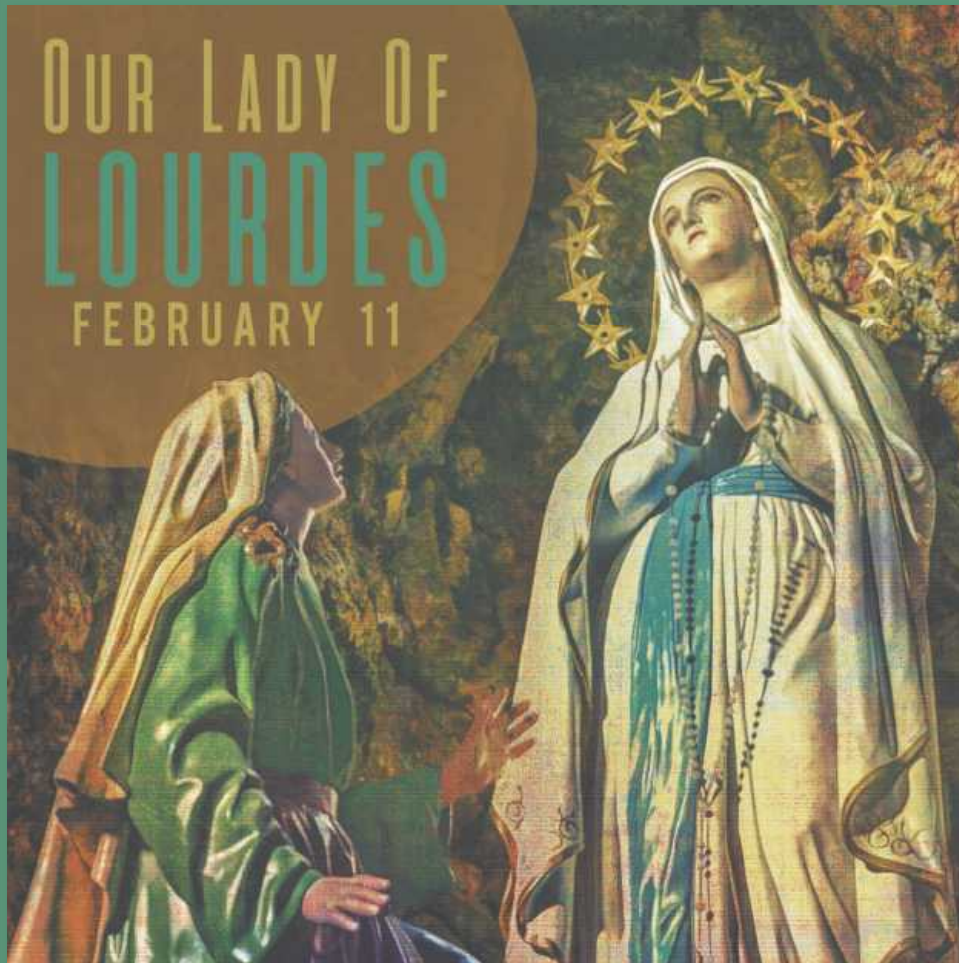

A MESSAGE FROM FR MICHAEL

Over the past couple of weeks a few parishioners have suggested I put in the bulletin the announcement of my moving on from Saint Anthony and St Mary parishes. The folks mentioned they were away the weekend of January 11th & 12th, when I made the announcement, and know others were too. I am grateful for the suggestion. Below is the text of my announcement.

As most of you know, I have been a priest for 31+ years. In all of my assignments over those years, my goal has been to serve God well by being of best service to the people of my assignments. Over the past many weeks I have been reflecting on whether I am the right priest to pastor and be of best service to our parishes and Collaborative. After much prayer and discernment I believe that the people of our parishes would be best served by a priest with a different skill set than I have. While there are several reasons that have guided me to this conclusion, one is that I believe - at this point in the development of the parishes and Collaborative - the parishes would be best served by a pastor who will be involved in the small details of the daily operations of each of our parishes.

It is with great pleasure that I share with you that Cardinal Sean is appointing Fr Scott Euvard as the new pastor of Saint Anthony Parish and Saint Mary Parish, effective February 24, 2020. I know Fr Scott. He is a great pastor who has been successfully leading the Living Water Catholic collaborative in Amesbury/Salisbury for the past six years.

Permit me this opportunity to thank you all for the support that you have given me over these past months. I am most grateful and will keep you all, and the success of Christ By the Sea Collaborative, held in prayer. It has been an honor getting to know you, the 200+ parishioners I have met during the Tuesday Conversations with Father Michael, and praying Holy Mass together daily and on the weekends. You will always have a special place in my memory, and I look forward to hearing about the great things that will happen in each parish in the years to come.

FROM FR. SCOTT: MY KEY RESPONSIBILITY AREAS PART I

Though the number of priests available for assignment in the Archdiocese of Boston continues to decline and, as a result, the responsibilities landing on the priest's plate continue to increase, the expectations people have for priests are often based on days gone by when the number of priests available for assignment was significantly higher. In this landscape, it is important to be clear about my key responsibility areas. This week I share with you two of my key responsibility areas in the parishes. Next week I will share with you two more of my key responsibility areas. When deciding how to spend my time and energy, I look to these key responsibility areas. Though I may bear ultimate responsibility for all that happens in the parishes, if what is being expected of me does not fit into one of my key responsibility areas, then proximate responsibility for it needs to be shifted to a staff member or lay leader.

- Prepare, preach, and preside for sacramental celebrations in order that people encounter the Risen Christ and be strengthened to live as his disciples.
- Equip, co-mission, and support staff and lay leaders in order that they will be prepared for the work of ministry and building up the body of Christ. (Ephesians 4:12)

As we move forward, please join me in turning to Jesus Christ in prayer for all impacted by this upcoming transition – the parishioners and staff members of the Catholic parishes in Amesbury and Salisbury and Cohasset and Hull, Father Michael, and me.

SOCIAL JUSTICE MINISTRY

"The measure of the greatness of a society is found in the way it treats those most in need, those who have nothing apart from their poverty." - Pope Francis

My Brother's Keeper is an outreach service based in Taunton, MA that delivers furniture and food to local families in need. Their mission is *"To bring the love and hope of Jesus Christ to those we serve."* Each time they make a delivery, they leave a crucifix with the message *"we're just the delivery people, this is the man who sent you the furniture."* The organization ensures that respect is a key component of their interactions with those they serve. The do not judge. They serve with dignity. No one seeking assistance is required to justify their need. And their delivery vehicles are unmarked to protect the privacy of those receiving help.

My Brother's Keeper was founded in 1988 by a husband and wife serving families in need from the basement of their home. Today, 4,000 volunteers and 12 employees

work together from two facilities to make 9,000 deliveries a year. Over the past 30 years, they have made 140,000 total deliveries to struggling families and individuals across eastern Massachusetts.

Each year at this time we support this ministry, we hope you can help support it this year! There is information and a collection box for donations in the back of the gathering space. We, the people at My Brother's Keeper and those they serve thank you!



DISCIPLES IN MISSION
