FR. HANS' PAIR O' DIMES

Fr. Dave is back this weekend, which means I will be relegated to page 682 of the bulletin after this. It's been fun while it lasted!

A question came up recently about what are some really useful and helpful Catholic apps. This seems especially important when we have so much less access to things in general. We have no missals in the pews, we're not able to come to Church every weekend, we are seeing a greater emphasis and need for knowing how to pray well at home, and to grow in our faith in other ways. And our world runs on apps. What are some of the best?

The app I use the most is called **iBreviary**. It is specifically meant for praying the Liturgy of the Hours, and if enough of you ask me, "What is the Liturgy of the Hours?", a future bulletin column may ensue. iBreviary also includes all of the readings and prayers for mass each day, as well as the texts of most of the Catholic Ritual Books, including blessings, baptisms, funerals, and weddings. I haven't used my phone for most of these, but the one I have used is Anointing of the Sick, when someone asks for it on very short notice.

Universalis is similar to iBreviary, including the Liturgy of the Hours and the Daily Mass readings. Universalis also offers a lot more material for personal reflection, including daily spiritual readings and lives of the Saints, Lectio Divina, the Angelus, and the Rosary. It will also remind you when it's time to pray!

Another fantastic app for both study and prayer is **Laudate**. Laudate has just about everything you could

possibly want to support your faith life: the Liturgy of the Hours, a daily prayer and bible verse, the complete Order of Mass, how to pray the Rosary, various chaplets, the Stations of the Cross, a variety of other prayers (some in Latin), multiple translations of the bible, the Catechism, and links to other Catholic media.

A quick search online gave me even more apps:

- ✠ **FORMED** includes a ton of audio and video for adults and children, and is a great way to change your media consumption to be more upbuilding.
- ✠ **Magnificat** is an electronic version of the physical monthly subscription booklet, and they've been offering a discount to subscribe due to COVID-19.
- ✠ **Relevant Radio** is the go-to app for Catholic radio.
- ✠ The **Catholic Calendar** app gives you the liturgical calendar, information and meditation on the saints and feast days, the daily Order of Mass, and more.

There are many, many, MANY more Catholic apps out there, so I encourage you to do some searches of your own. Find what will help you to both learn and pray in whatever circumstances you are. I use iBreviary most because it includes what I want and need in my prayer life, but that doesn't mean it's right for everybody. Find an app which will help you personally to grow closer to Jesus, and use it!

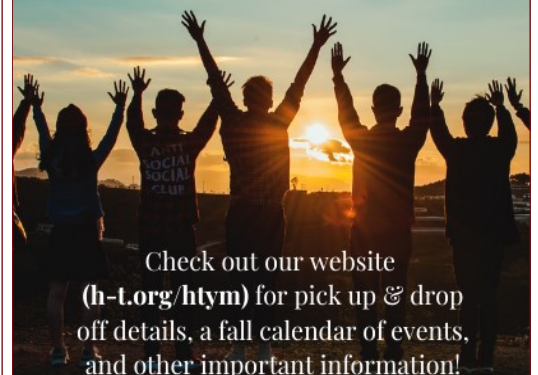
October is *Respect Life Month*. *May God help us to be people of life, defending and protecting all life from conception and birth to natural death, and all that falls in between. Amen! +*

A Joint Column by the HT Health & Social Justice Ministries

The Challenge of Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship – Part Two: Making Moral Choices & Applying Our Principles

Policy Issue: Human Life & Dignity

As direct attacks on life itself, our Catholic faith makes clear that abortion and euthanasia are morally wrong. The USCCB identifies “two temptations in public life” that can distort the Church’s defense of human life and dignity (HLD) in *Faithful Citizenship*: a “moral equivalence that makes no ethical distinctions between different kinds of issues involving [HLD]” and “the misuse of these necessary moral distinctions as a way of dismissing or ignoring other serious threats to [HLD].”

The CDC reported last year that the number, rate, and ratio of abortions in the U.S. are at their lowest since recording began in 1969, but significant, well-documented disparities exist. For women of color, the abortion rate is 1.8-3.8 times higher compared to white women; and while overall poverty rates are at historic lows, their average household income remains significantly lower in comparison as well.

Studies have repeatedly shown that lack of support for raising a child and financial instability are the primary reasons women choose abortion. Thus, we must ensure these root causes are eradicated by protecting affordable health care, opposing housing discrimination, eliminating hunger, supporting equitable income, and addressing similar socioeconomic concerns.

How many times since March have you heard, “Things will be a little (a lot) different this year”? Personally, I have lost track not only of how many times I have heard it, but how many times I have said it. Unfortunately, I need to say it again: when it comes to the way we provide assistance at Thanksgiving and Christmas, 2020 will be different than any we have done before.

Honestly, I do not yet know exactly what it is going to look like. I do know that the collecting of food and gifts the way we have always done it are out. Not only would it be difficult to ensure social distancing in the various phases of collection, repackaging, and distribution, but the different spaces that are used have been repurposed.

Believe it or not, the little garage space that is attached to the Food Closet is the main area used for all of the Thanksgiving production efforts. Collection, storage, repacking, and distribution, including turkeys, are all done there. Tight but functional! This year, that same space is already serving full time as our daily distribution center. Since no one can come inside, we bring the food outside and that’s one of the places we do it.

With no safe and reasonable way to have a Giving Tree and no safe and reasonable way to accept, sort, and store the gifts, that will change as well. Various ideas are being discussed, but none of them look like 2019 and before.

This week I will be reaching out to some of the various organizations we have supported in the past to see what is different for them; how might we be able to support their needs, but in a different manner. I suspect the picture will become more clear when I do. As I learn more from them I will share the updates with you. One thing I do know already: it will be different!



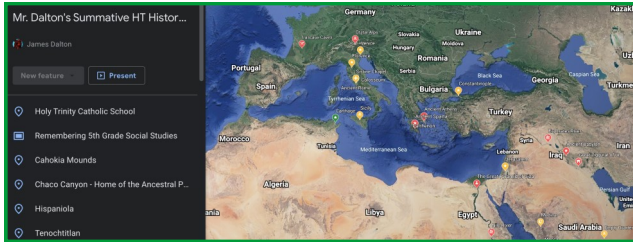
