FR. HANS' PAIR O' DIMES

Saint Benedict taught his monks to observe Lent as a time of greater fasting and prayer, saying:

During these days, therefore, we will add to the usual measure of our service something by way of private prayer and abstinence from food or drink, so that each of us will have something above the assigned measure to offer God... Let each one deny himself some food, drink, sleep, needless talking and idle jesting, and look forward to holy Easter with joy and spiritual longing.

St. Benedict goes on to point out the importance of accountability, not just to help us follow through on our plans, but also to make sure what we're doing isn't just to increase our pride in our own abilities.

Everyone should, however, make known to the abbot what he intends to do, since it ought to be done with his prayer and approval. Whatever is undertaken without the permission of the spiritual father will be reckoned as presumption and vainglory, not deserving a reward. Therefore, everything must be done with the abbot's approval.

In our case, we're not monks or nuns, and so our

method of accountability looks a little different. Instead of to an abbot, we will be accountable to each other for our individually chosen Lenten practices in small Accountability Groups of 3-4 people. Online sign-ups for are open through Monday, 2/15 (h-t.org/lent). I will select groups and email leaders on Tuesday. You can also form your own group without signing-up.

Meetings will be relatively short, once a week during Lent, and probably using Zoom. Discussion will focus on how each member is doing with their Lenten practices, and encouraging each other for the coming week. Members might also help each other adjust if their plans are either too difficult or too easy.

Below are Suggested Lenten Practices developed by our Pastoral Council. For those who already know what you want to do, go for it! We have even more resources online at h-t.org/lent, including a donation form for the CRS Rice Bowl collection, meatless recipes, and other ideas/activities for families and individuals. Also, while we won't be doing Soup Suppers, we *will* have socially-distanced Stations of the Cross every Friday at 7:00pm in the church.

EXPLORING FRATELLI TUTTI

A Joint Column by the HT Health & Social Justice Ministries

Chapter Seven: "Paths of Renewed Encounter"

"Truth, in fact, is an inseparable companion of justice and mercy. All three together are essential to building peace; each, moreover, prevents the other from being altered."

Pope Francis highlights the needs for peacemakers to forge paths of healing ("renewed encounters") in our fractured world. He explains that building peace requires "starting anew from the truth," historical truth, by facing the harsh reality of the harm done. Recent turmoil and unrest has made this aspect of societal friendship even more prominent in our calling as Catholics. Engaging in a renewed encounter does not mean revisiting a time of conflict, he says, but that pain and conflict should transform us. Only by basing this truth on historical events can we create a broad and persevering effort to understand one another.

We need to heal our wounds, which requires both seeking and offering forgiveness. Yet, to forgive is not to forget. When we start from the truth we make possible justice and mercy, as all are inseparable. We invite you to get involved in building peace in our communities and societies. Discuss with your loved ones bias we see in the media, movies and television. **How will you become involved in forgiveness and peace building in our Parish community?**
