"Let me love you, my Lord and my God, and see myself as I really am" – Wow, what a way to begin a prayer! Am I confident enough to actually ask God for this?

The author of this prayer, *Pope Clement XI*, is! Clement continues, *"a pilgrim in this world, a Christian."* Let's consider this. First, what Clement says for himself also pertains to us, so he calls us *pilgrims in this world*. Our real home is heaven, and as far as earth goes, we are just visiting. Clement names us *Christians*, followers of Jesus and he reminds what that means. Week one without AI! So far the closet is still standing and families continue to be fed. Let’s be honest, I am going to ride AI’s good works for a few months, not to mention I have

an amazing volunteer team that will not let this ministry fail. I am constantly learning more details on the running the Food Closet: bread runs, milk and produce delivery, etc. There are lot of details to wrap my head around but the more I am in the mix the more I enjoy it.

A new program that started last week is a direct result of our partnership with the Village Baptist Church. As AI mentioned a few weeks ago, we took the food from the Village Church when they closed their food pantry. Most of the donations that they received were from local libraries. The libraries would put a box out and ask for non-perishable donations. Not all libraries are currently open, so when I gave out our information, I really did not think we would get a lot of response. I was wrong; we got a pretty sizeable donation from the Aloha Library. So far the response has been really good and the staff at the library is willing to drop of the donations. I am inspired by them caring enough to make a difference.

During the school year, we work with a few local schools to ensure that they have food for families in their community. Now that school is ending, we will continue to find new ways to get them the food to those that need it during the summer months. Unfortunately, food needs do not take a holiday. I will keep you posted.
