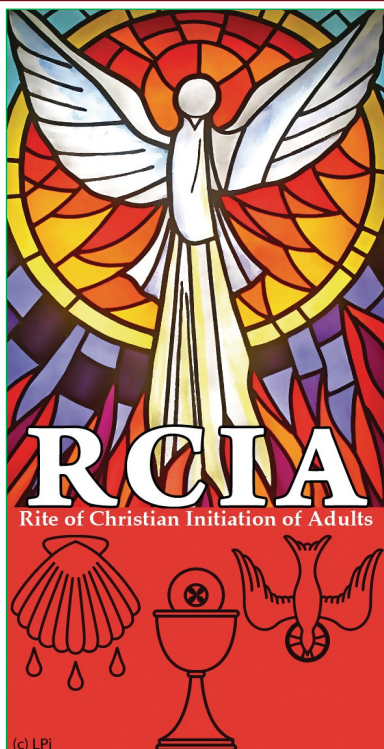

Our continuing call to holiness and conversion. So, after reading that opening statement, what happened next? Did we perk up, sit up metaphorically attentive to what was coming next? Or did our spiritual radar go down so that all we heard was *blah blah blah*, indicating that we aren't listening?

When I hear words like *holiness* and *conversion*, I listen like it doesn't pertain to me. That's not what scripture tells us. Here from St. Paul to the Ephesians: "*he chose us before the foundation of the world, to be holy and without blemish before him.*" How is this possible?

First, through our on-going conversion which continues to need to happen throughout our lifetime. Why does this need to happen continually? Because we sin! We are all sinners, but Jesus has given us a remedy. Confession, or reconciliation, or as St. Paul says to the Ephesians, "*In Him, we have redemption by His blood, the forgiveness of transgressions.*" Transgressions equals sin! So, friends, go to confession! I say this for myself as well as for all who are reading this.

What happens when we go and receive? "*The riches of His grace that he lavished upon us!*" We should say" lavishes (present tense) because it happens every time we receive this sacrament. Then sub the words *forgiveness* and *grace* for the word *sacrament* because it tells us what it is that we receive. *And then we are converted once again to continue being formed in the likeness and image of Jesus, the God who created us.* In the Eucharistic prayer we hear that we (all those who participate and receive) are called to be *a living sacrament* ourselves.

And then? *Become a sacrament that we share with everyone we encounter!* Something to consider and aspire to on these beautiful summer days. Have a great and **HOLY** week everybody! +
