GREETINGS FROM FR. DAVE

In my Monday video last week, I asked for help in not be live streaming the 5:30pm Mass or bringing reaching out to those who for many reasons are not Communion outside. Our Sunday 9:30am Mass will yet gathered with us for Mass. We continue to make progress towards becoming once again a vibrant homebound parishioners and to the group of folks worshipping community.

It struck me last weekend especially as we sang the opening song ("Come, Now is the Time to Worship"), how important it is for us to gather together in that worshipping. For sure we need private prayer AND we need our community worship too. Neither on their own is what God is asking of us.

That is why I ask your help in noticing folks who are no longer with us and in reaching out to them. I am especially concerned for those who have just gotten comfortable "doing Mass at home" (on their own schedule, with their pets, in their PJs) and those who have drifted away altogether. 16 months is plenty long to get out of the habit/commitment to join with us weekly.

And, we all welcome back those of you who are here! It's wonderful to see and hear the engagement of this wonderful parish - before and after Mass, as we worship, and at coffee and rolls afterwards!

As we get more folks back the need for live streaming and parking lot distribution of Communion is diminishing. Beginning Saturday, July 31st we will

continue to be live streamed as a service to our who have been tuning in around the country and beyond. Parking lot distribution of Communion will continue at 9:30am as long as there is a need as well.

Remember to keep our seminarians in your prayers. Here's some updates for you:

- Shawn has his final days with us this week before returning to Mt. Angel.
- Tristan (from last summer) heads off to Rome to continue studies at the end of the month.
- Dustin (from two summers ago), now a Deacon, heads back to Rome for his final two years.
- James (parishioner) is spending the summer in Nebraska for an intensive spirituality conference before returning to Mt. Angel.
- Justin (parishioner) is at the Cathedral for the rest of July before returning to Rome.




