



Over the last few months, I feel like I have gotten a pretty good handle of how to keep the pantry stocked with food and running smoothly. I think God realizes that one of my strengths is that I like to shop! The one aspect of this job I am constantly learning and fine tuning is being a good steward to those in need.

A couple weeks ago, we had a gentleman show up to ask about where and when the next dental van would be in the area. He did not have a computer and was currently living in his car. I went in the office, made a copy of the van locations, and helped him identify which ones were near him. I asked if he needed food, water, or anything else and he said no.

After I gave him the dental information, he began to tell me that he was a prophet, and that orbs of light were communicating with him. The only thought that came into my head at that time was to listen to him. So I did. He explained in very great detail his experiences and what they meant to him. He quoted scriptures from the Bible and explained that he was special. He was excited and passionate and it gave him joy.

Most of the things he was describing were things I would not think were normal, but to him it was everything. I realized that is not my job to judge anyone; everyone has their own unique experiences and my role is to be **as** compassionate and loving as I possibly can. I think I did an okay job with him but this an area I will need to continue to fine tune. I will continue to pray for patience and understanding, and I know I will be a better steward to the community. Thank you for your love and continued support!


