

The Red Cross is still facing a severe blood shortage nationwide of all blood types. Someone in the U.S. is in need of blood every two seconds, and that was before the COVID pandemic began. To end the shortage and meet current hospital demand, they need to collect more than 1,000 additional blood donations each day. Scientists can't manufacture a solution for this problem; only generous donors can fill this constant need, and one donation can potentially save multiple lives.

CCC 1730: God created man a rational being, conferring on him the dignity of a person who can initiate and control his own actions. "God willed that man should be 'left in the hand of his own counsel,' so that he might of his own accord seek his Creator and freely attain his full and blessed perfection by cleaving to him" (GS 17; Sir 15:14). Man is rational and therefore like God; he is created with free will and is master over his acts (St. Irenaeus, Adv. Haeres. 4, 4, 3: PG 7/1, 983).

"God created man a rational being": that's you and me, men and women, and that's directly out of the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC). We know this, by the way, also from the Creation Story in the Bible, which is where the Catechism gets this from.

CCC continues, "conferring on [them] the dignity of a person," and we know this too from the Bible, that we are created in the likeness and image of God. That means all of us, big and small, frail, healthy, young, and old. EVERYONE!

And it goes on, "who can initiate and control their own actions" — in other words, to begin and be responsible for. And we don't just get to, we NEED to decide and act, using our reason, our faith, our beliefs.

Why? "God willed that man should be 'left in the hand of his own counsel," or be responsible for OURSELVES. That is how God created us, "so that he might of his own accord seek his Creator." This means we, on our own volition, can choose to seek and find God, to know His ways, and to accept them or not.

When we do, we "attain His full and blessed perfection by cleaving to Him." 'Cleave': adhere closely, stick, cling to. That allows God to form us, both our hearts and our minds.

"[We are] rational and therefore like God; [we are] created with free will and [are] master over [our] acts." There is no better place to seek my answers than from God Himself and the faith that I profess.



Huge thanks to Tom Stoffel for creating our new after-hours food drop box! It is located by the garage in the covered area (a more permanent sign is in the works).






