- ✦ If you have been coming to Holy Trinity regularly, we invite you to get registered here. Also, if your contact info has changed please let us know. Easiest way to do both is on our website: www.h-t.org/registration. You can also stop by the Information Desk after Mass if you aren't a fan of going online.
- ✦ Fr. Tony and I are eager to serve in the best possible way. We are happy to anoint folks before or after any of our Masses in addition to our First Wednesday of the month anointings at the 8:15am Mass. If you or a loved one become seriously ill and/or homebound, please don't wait until the last moment to ask for anointing.
- ✦ Pew Hospitality: avoid insisting on sitting on the ends of the pews and requiring later arrivals to climb over you. Even at church we

strive to put others needs over our own comfort.

- ✦ Please accompany young children to the restroom.
- ✦ Remember that our gathering for Mass is our public worship of the church. Avoid personal expressions of piety that do not follow the practice of the community. I am especially concerned about folks who genuflect or kneel before receiving communion as this poses a trip hazard to those behind them. This is one of those areas where we're asked to sacrifice our personal piety for the sake of the Church's public worship.

BRETT'S TWO CENTS

Hello, everyone! Two riddles to warm up your brains, and then an announcement. First, the riddles:

1. If you were running a race and you passed the person in second place, what place would you now be in?
2. A doctor and a bus driver are both in love with the same woman, Sarah. The bus driver had to go on a long bus trip that would last a week. Before he left, he gave Sarah seven apples. Why?

Okay, announcement: One of the challenges we run into with such a large parish, particularly as we get into the fall, is having enough Masses available for those who would like to “have a Mass said” or “offer a Mass” for someone. A couple of years ago, we did some homework and found that Church law allows us to schedule no more than two Masses per week with multiple intentions attached to them. Since the graces of the Mass are infinite, an intention offered as part of a “shared Mass” counts just as much as if it were the only intention for that Mass. Accordingly, we began allowing two of our weekday Masses each week be a shared Mass with two intentions.

That change has helped a lot, but we still end up “filling the calendar” for the year before the year is up. Last year, our calendar was full in early December (a huge improvement from being full in mid-July when we didn’t have shared Masses!) but this year we were full in mid-September – *including* our

shared Masses. Sadly, this has resulted in our needing to send people elsewhere in search of an available Mass for the last month.

After reading more on Church law regarding Mass intentions, we’ve determined that it is appropriate to allow for more than two intentions for a single shared Mass. Erica was able to move intentions that had been made with no specific date or notice requested, so we now have a good number of available Masses to schedule an intention through the end of the year, along with the option to add an intention to one of our two weekday shared Masses, if you’re wanting to schedule it sooner rather than later.

Hopefully, this will allow us to serve everyone that would like to have Mass offered for whatever intention is on their heart. If you have questions or concerns, feel free to ask me, Fr. Dave, or Fr. Tony.

To schedule an intention, email (parish@h-t.org) or call Erica or come in to the office. If you’re wanting to schedule intentions for *next* year, however, please wait until November to send her an email with your list of requests; she gets the new calendar toward the end of the month and will then begin scheduling those requests in December. Reach out to Erica if you have any other questions about scheduling an intention!
