GREETINGS FROM FR. DAVE

Last week in my column, I encouraged those of you new to the parish or with new contact info to help us update our records. You can do that at the Info Desk before or after any Mass, on our website, or by calling our office. Especially as we move forward rebuilding our parish after the months of disruption with COVID, the need for an accurate member list is crucial. Thanks!

This weekend, my homily is going to be about managing anxiety as followers of Jesus. COVID has heightened anxiety for many and recent studies done of our young people show sobering data about hopelessness — due to COVID, climate change, politics, unraveling of institutions, division. As people of faith we have powerful tools to use — not to insulate us from anxiety and fear, but to help manage it.

Unique to Christianity is the truth that God has literally entered our world in the person of Jesus and is familiar from the inside with our humanness — in all its dimensions, good and hard. And, for us the cross remains a powerful symbol of hope. United with Jesus we are immersed in a pattern called the Paschal Mystery, where death leads to Resurrection; loss leads to renewal; darkness leads to light.

Rooting ourselves in that truth gives us strength and focus, and staying rooted takes effort and

commitment on our part. Daily prayer, sacraments, community, Bible reading — all are time-proven ways we have of being open to God's hope and grace in the midst of the inevitable insecurities we face.

Words from the Surrender Novena that I recite often: "Jesus I surrender myself to you. Take care of everything as you see fit." Yes! And, words from Fr. Ron Rolheiser:

"For all of us who are wounded, take those wounds to the Eucharist. Every time you stand by an altar and receive communion, bring your helplessness and paralysis to God. Ask God to touch your body, your heart, your memory, your bitterness, your lack of self-confidence, your self-absorption, your weaknesses, your impotence. Bring your aching body and heart to God. Express your helplessness in simple, humble words: Touch me. Take my wounds. Take my paranoia. Make me whole. Give me forgiveness. Warm my heart. Give me the strength that I cannot give myself."

Funeral services were held last week for Phyllis Kainz, Loretta Squires, and Gladys House. Services are scheduled on Tuesday at 10:30am for Laura Cochran. The memorial service for Fr. John Waldron has been scheduled for Saturday, November 6th at 11:00am. May their souls and all the souls of the faithful departed, rest in peace.

Our Lady of Fatima: The Miracle of the Sun

On May 13, 1917, a beautiful lady, dressed in white, appeared to three poor children: Jacinta, Francisco, and Lucia. Our Lady asked them to come back to the same place, at the same time, on the 13th day of the month for the next five months in a row, and then she would tell them what she wanted, and she promised a miracle. Over 50,000 people heard her requests and saw and experienced the miracle on October 13, 1917.

Fast forward to October 13, 2021. We know the crux of the story, but what has changed? Perhaps not enough. Thank God for the faithful that do what Mary asked, on behalf of the whole world! It's the way of the world and sinful distracted humanity. We have other things that have taken our attention. Or perhaps we never knew.

At Fatima, we were asked to entrust ourselves to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, our mother. Mary asked us to pray a rosary every day. Every time we pray a rosary, Mary prays with us. We show our trust in *her intercession and prayer for us*. We also show honor for what Mary has done for us as the mother of Jesus.

Medicare open enrollment for 2022 coverage began October 15th and continues through December 7th. Oregon SHIBA (Senior Health Insurance Benefits Assistance) has certified Medicare counselors who can give you unbiased, free information concerning coverage and insurance options. It's flu season once again! Getting your flu vaccination has never been more important. While flu activity remains low at this time throughout the country, there is serious concern that this year's flu season will be more severe than last year. If you haven't already, we strongly recommend that you get vaccinated as soon as possible. After you are vaccinated, your body takes about two weeks to develop antibodies that protect against the flu. 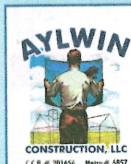
