GREETINGS FROM FR. DAVE

Happy Halloween/All Saints'/All Souls' Weekend! How's that for layering it on thick?! Actually all three fit together quite naturally as we begin our November Homily Series: "Our Magnificent Destiny".

Especially in Oregon, these events take place just as we go through a major season shift and see the leaves falling (in abundance with the stormy weather this past week), the days getting shorter, and the end of the garden season. Our Christian faith gives us the absolute assurance that because of Jesus' Life, Death, and Resurrection, we can live boldly knowing that our own times of darkness lead to new light, our losses move towards renewal (often in unexpected ways), and death leads to new life.

This pattern is central to our Christian faith and overlays and underlies everything in our world and in our lives. Trust that! Expect it! Live accordingly! Next weekend, I will speaking in my homily about Heaven. Get ready for a hope-filled message. It's all really good news!

I always find it tender seeing the list of names on our November banners. As you know, each has their own story! Our youngest death this year was in his teens; our oldest was 101. Again this year about a third were totally unexpected deaths, a third totally expected, and the remaining had underlying issues that led to their death. May their souls and all the souls of the faithful departed, rest in peace. Our Book of Remembrance is in place to include additional names for our prayers during the month, or you can add

names to our Online Book of Remembrance at h-t.org/book-of-remembrance. Entries will be printed weekly and added to the physical book in the church.

Chris Storm, our campus minister and Director of Religious Education, is leading Grow Group for the next three Wednesdays with a powerful presentation titled, "Confirmation: Reclaimed!". If you have not heard him present before, he is amazing and highly engaging. The three sessions (**November 3, 10 & 17**) highlight the benefits and richness we have received through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Confirmation. Starts this Wednesday **at the usual Grow Group time of 6:00-7:30pm via Zoom** (sorry for the time typo in last weekend's bulletin!). I promise this will be GOOD stuff and well worth the time! **If you are not already on the Grow Group mailing list** and want to take part in this series, sign-up online at h-t.org/grow-group#reclaimed. The Zoom link will be emailed to you.

BRETT'S TWO CENTS

Hello everyone! Happy Halloween! This weekend we're celebrating the Feast of All Saints at all of our Masses. One of the fun things about being Catholic is odd little stories you find in every nook and cranny of the Church's history, and the saints are no exception. Most of us, when we hear the word "saint," probably think of qualities such as pious, reserved, dour, meek, etc. Ha! Saints are vibrant, and irresistibly human. St. Jerome was famous for his grouchy disposition, and you definitely didn't want to get on his bad side. Teresa of Avila was famous for her irrepressible gaiety; one of her famous sayings was, "May God deliver us from sullen saints and silly devotions!"

For those of you who appreciate the weird, try St. Guinefort. Believe it or not, St. Guinefort was a dog! Legends say this 13th century French hound was left to guard his master's baby while the master was hunting. When the master returned, he found Guinefort covered in blood, and no sign of the baby. Assuming the worst, Guinefort's master flew into a rage and killed him — only to immediately afterwards hear the sound of his baby's cry. When he went to investigate, he found the child unharmed under the bed, along with a bloody, dead viper. Guinefort had been true to his charge after all. Feeling awful, the master buried

Guinefort and set up a shrine in his honor. Supposedly people came from all over to pray there, and several miracles were attributed to Guinefort's intercession. As you might guess, the Church has tried several times to suppress devotion to Guinefort. . .always unsuccessfully. Too fun!

Or how about St. Denis? This 3rd century bishop was so successful as a preacher that the local pagans had him arrested and beheaded. Undaunted, Denis picked up his head and continued preaching, walking about six miles before finally expiring (you can't make this stuff up!). On the spot where he died, a shrine was built, which later became the site of the Basilica of St. Denis. This is the church where French kings and queens were buried for centuries.

You know, when I was young, I used to think saints were boring. Probably because I only got the sanitized versions of their stories. If you'd like to deepen your own knowledge and love for the saints, one really easy resource is morningoffering.com. Go there, sign up for their daily emails, and each morning you'll get a brief meditation, the readings for the day, and a brief (but always interesting) saint story for the day.

The Four Last Things . . . do we know what these are? For all of us, they are the last things that we encounter on earth at the end of our lives. They are **Death, Judgement, Heaven, and Hell**. I am not kidding, and this is not a bad joke without a punchline. Instead, it is to be the last four things that all of us experience. The *Catechism* and *Scripture* confirm this, and yet these catch us unprepared. These four things often don't even come to mind when prompted, leaving us speechless.

In the beauty of our Catholic faith, the month of November reminds us of this in a more beautiful and poignant way. On walls of our sanctuary are banners with the names of those in the parish who have died this last year, and in the Book of Remembrance near our altar are the names of all our loved ones who we have placed there, that they can be prayed for and remembered at the Masses throughout the month. We are all destined for a time on that wall. In this list, someone is the oldest, the youngest, the least and most expected to be there, but in all these deaths linger the culmination of those *Four Last Things*.

In Latin, *Memento Mori* means *remember that you will die*; and, in the remembering, face that possibility at the end of every day of our lives, assessing ourselves before God does. We all want to go to heaven. Let's spend this life following our Lord in leading the kind of lives that will help us to get there. With a merciful God, our Lord, Jesus Christ, who always leads us in His direction if we let Him, which is the direction of Heaven itself. Let's follow the advice of His mother and ours, as Mary said in scripture, *"Do whatever He tells you."* (John 2:5).

Amen? **AMEN!** +

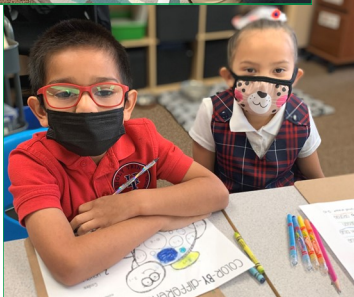
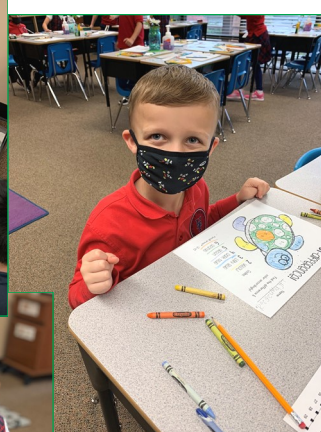

Classroom Spotlight: Math Stations in First Grade

Math Stations (or Centers) is an ideal way for teachers to differentiate instruction and learning based on student need, ability and learning style. Ms. Klobes runs four stations with help from Mrs. May (first grade Learning Support) and

Mrs. Gould (Learning Resource Teacher). Students rotate through the stations to practice the day's math lesson: card game, manipulatives, paper/pencil practice, and time with Ms. Klobes for specialized instruction. Stations are often our student's favorite way to learn!

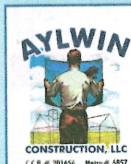
