Praying Book Club Have you ever compared the Beatitudes in the Gospels of Matthew & Luke? Raniero Cantalamessa, O.F.M. CAP highlights subtle differences with significant meaning. Matthew says, "Blessed are the poor in spirit" where Luke says, "Blessed are you poor." Matthew's "poor in spirit" points to an interior attitude more than the social aspect emphasized by Luke. What Jesus has in mind by proclaiming the poor "blessed" is that these people have a better readiness to believe. They are not self-sufficient, they do not have a closed attitude, & they don't believe they can save themselves. They fully depend on God with great faith. Jesus exemplified perfect poverty by choosing to live poorly & be poor with no earthly possessions, he accepted scarcity, hunger, thirst, cold, hard work, austerity, & hardship. Most importantly, he accepted God's will and was stripped of his divine nature. He became a servant out of love for us. A precious gift indeed! The question that remains is, are you poor in spirit?
