## **September 15, 2019 - 24<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time** “*Everything I have is yours.*” (Luke 15:31)

Our Heavenly Father gives us everything, including the chance to share in His eternal kingdom. Yet, like the Prodigal Son, we are often lured away by the materialism of our society. Do we really want to turn our backs on all that God offers in exchange for a material wealth that has no lasting value?

**Condolences for the Marcella Schlekewy Family:** Yesterday at Sacred Heart Church, we celebrated a Funeral Mass for Marcella Schlekewy from Britton. Linda Bergeson is her daughter. We offer condolences to Marcella's family and pray for Marcella. May her soul and the souls of all the faithful departed through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

**Catholic End of Life Talk:** I will offer a ten – fifteen minute presentation immediately after this Sunday's Masses titled “End of Life Planning from a Catholic Perspective.” I answer the following typical questions about end of life issues among others: Must medical treatment always be continued? Are Catholics allowed to have Living Wills? What is Church teaching about “Death with Dignity” and Catholic health care directives? I have handouts available in the church entrances.

**Gregorian Masses for a Poor Soul:** This was popularized by Pope St. Gregory the Great, as a series of thirty (30) Masses offered consecutively for thirty days for the repose of the soul of an individual departed person. According to this pious belief the individual soul, if in Purgatory, immediately goes to heaven after the completion of these Holy Masses. The Sacred Congregation on Indulgences has declared that “the offering of Gregorian Masses has a special efficacy for obtaining from God the speedy deliverance of a suffering soul, and that this is a pious and reasonable belief of the faithful.” This devotion is due to Pope St. Gregory the Great writing in his fourth book *Dialogues* about when he was an abbot prior to being Pope, fearing that a certain monk may have to spend a long time suffering in purgatory, had thirty Masses offered for him, one each day consecutively, for thirty days. On the thirtieth day he appeared to a brother monk to tell him he was freed from Purgatory due to the thirty Masses offered for the repose of his soul. These Masses do not have to be offered by the same priest, but he is making a serious obligation by accepting the Gregorian Mass stipend to successfully accomplish this whether or not he is able to offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on any scheduled day. He will have to have at least one backup priest ready on any given day to avoid interruption. Failure to do this means restarting the series of Masses. A web search will provide offers of this service. Arrangements can be made to have Gregorian Masses offered for oneself after death upon notification by a survivor as directed. This direction can be in important papers to be read after one's death or stated in one's Last Will & Testament. (Over)

## FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

**Condolences for the Roger Buhl Family:** We had a burial of Roger Buhl's remains on Sat., Aug. 31<sup>st</sup>, 2019 in St. Joseph Cemetery, Lake City. He was from Brookings. We pray for him and his family. May he rest in peace. Amen.

**Second Collection due to Hurricane Dorian:** We will have this second collection next Sun., Sept. 22<sup>nd</sup> as authorized by Bishop Swain. The financial assistance goes to the U.S. Catholic Bishops without local costs to Catholic Relief Services to provide assistance outside of our country and to Catholic Charities USA to provide assistance inside our country. Bishop Swain encourages contributions through these established Church-approved agencies to assure accountability and minimal administrative costs. You also can make checks out to your local parish and note that it is for Hurricane Dorian relief. Bishop Swain asks us to offer prayers for those who have died, have been dislocated, and those whose lives have been changed forever by this natural disaster. He prays, "May Our Lady of Sorrows comfort them."

**Inner Healing Opportunity:** The Matthew Ministry is coming to Sisseton this Friday and Saturday, Sept. 20<sup>th</sup> & 21<sup>st</sup>. Mike Snyder and Jane Barz will speak at St. Kateri Tekakwitha Parish Hall (619 N. Main Ave., Sisseton) Friday evening from 7:00-9:30 pm. At this session they explore the anatomy of our painful spirits and injured hearts. They then explain a biblically based means of finding inner healing and freedom. They write: "Healing comes when [we] allow ourselves to open our hearts to the Spirit of Truth and allow Jesus to heal us. Through His Power, Grace and Strength He will show us where we need to go to receive healing and freedom. He will help us go to places we did not think we could." The name of their ministry derives in part from Matthew 13:15-16 and the promise of Jesus to heal. Mike and Jane report that some people find healing just by the understanding they gain through the instruction session; but they will also offer individual prayer ministry sessions on Saturday, September 21<sup>st</sup> at St. Kateri Tekakwitha Parish Church. These 45-minute sessions are by appointment 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Attending the Friday evening presentation is mandatory before starting a prayer session, unless you have previously attended this presentation. To sign up for a prayer session prior to completing the Friday session, call the Catholic Community Office at 605-698-7414, or after hours, call Fr. Jerry at 605-730-2744. If all appointments fill up for Saturday, Jane and Mike will graciously offer more opportunities on Sunday. They do this on a donation basis.
