



FROM THE PASTOR



f was with curiosity, then growing alarm and finally stomach churning horror that freedom loving people in our country witnessed the events at the U.S. Capitol last January 6th. Congress had been called to session to ratify the true, valid, honest election of a new President of the United States

when they suddenly had to abandon their constitutional duty in the face of an unimaginable and shocking invasion of the Capitol by people claiming to be patriotic Americans intent on doing one thing: destroy the very foundations of the democratic republic that has been a beacon of hope and liberty for more than two hundred years. Egged on by fallacious reports of a fraudulent election that "stole" the will of the people, these seditious hooligans not only broke into the Capitol but violated both chambers of congress, did considerable physical damage to the building and its contents and even broke into lawmakers' offices, posing as conquering heroes. Every true American who considers himself/herself a patriot ought to be saddened and infuriated by what took place. How can anyone who loves this country watch that and not cry. However, this is nothing less than the culmination of the downward slide that this nation has endured for several years.

People on one side were quick to condemn the attack on the Capitol but are equally quick to support and encourage events like we witnessed this past summer and the ongoing riots in places like Portland, Oregon. People on the other side condemn the riots of the past summer, labeling the rioters lawless thugs, but support the ideology of those whose "right to protest" evolved into bloody chaos at the Capitol. Support by anyone for the actions that bring destruction and death to the streets of America simply cannot be accepted as the American way of settling differences. What is wrong with us? How have we gotten here? Both sides of violence do little more than tear up the Constitution of the United States and trample the *rights* of a free people.

How did we get here? Perhaps it started with the destruction of the family where the basic unit of civilized society has been undermined by the current self-centered thought process that "there's nothing wrong with what I'm doing because that's the way I feel." Consequently, healthy marriage is cast aside, abortion becomes acceptable (even for too many "good" Catholics), children are a financial burden rather than a blessing. Prayer in public is outlawed, unless it becomes so generic that it's meaningless; sexual identity becomes a matter of choice and even children are allowed to pick what they want to be; discipline can't be enforced so as not to make a person feel bad. Congressional language now has been "neutered" on the floor to the point where prayer now ends with "Amen and A-Women." (!) Is it any wonder that the fundamental belief in human dignity has become so degraded that events like Portland and the assault on the Capitol – and thus on America itself- can happen?

What do we do? Love your family members. Mend a quarrel. Realize other people have valid opinions and, if there's disagreement, let it be civil. RETURN TO PRAYER! Give weekly worship and praise to God at Mass and don't treat it as something less important than a soccer game or golf day.

Our nation is in deep trouble, but it's not too late to stop the slide. We can do it but we have to remember: Let our faith guide our politics, not our politics guide our faith.

MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY

QUARANTINE BLUES: 5 WAYS TO HELP YOUR FAMILY COPE WHILE YOU'RE ALL COOPED UP (PART 1) |

Beyond the obvious challenges we all face in dealing with the pandemic, many households are experiencing real shock as the activities that used to fill our days suddenly come to a grinding halt. Schools are closed. People are working from home. Life as we know it has been upended.

On the relational front, "sheltering in place" is guaranteed to ramp up your family dynamic at least tenfold. When you're around each other 24/7, you can't avoid little irritations and personality conflicts as easily as you can when you're running in a million different directions. That can be intimidating, but you can make it work to your advantage if you keep a few tips in mind.

1. Make a routine and stick to it.

When our schedules get thrown out of whack, we're tempted to let our routines go out the door. All of a sudden we start getting up and going to bed at different times. Mealtimes become a free -for-all. Chores may or may not get done. That can be fine for vacations, but for times like this, maintaining routines are critical for managing expectations and cultivating a sense of normalcy. You don't have to maintain the exact same schedule you did when the kids were in school and you were going to the office, but it would be a good idea to create a schedule and stick to it. Get up at the same time every day. Get dressed. Eat meals together at regular times. Pick specific days for laundry, cleaning and other chores. Go to bed at the same time every evening. Sticking to a routine can feel a little arbitrary when the school bus isn't coming and your boss doesn't see you coming in late, but do it anyway. The fact is, kids and adults need routines to feel safe, cared for and connected. When we're going through chaotic times, stable family routines help your household become a little island of sanity in a world gone mad.

2. Manage your relationships.

When we're following our normal schedule, we're used to finding ways to connect (and stay out of each other's way) as we move from thing to thing. But when the normal schedules are kaput, everyone's expectations for the day - and each other inevitably begin to clash. Now is the time to become more intentional about managing your relationships. If you want to function as a real team, you're going to have to start planning for it. Break up the day into chunks. At breakfast, have a short conversation about what you all need/want to do with your time until lunch. At the same time, discuss little things each family member can do to take care of each other over the next few hours. Are there times when you will especially need quiet for a conference call? What can everyone do during that time? Are there certain chores that really need to get done? How can you work together (or divide and conquer) to make them happen? Have the same conversation about the time between lunch and dinner, and dinner and bedtime. Instead of letting your family devolve into an every-person-for-themselves dynamic, manage your time and expectations. Become the team you're meant to be. (to be continued next week)



INTERFAITH SHELTER |

For the first time in 11 years, due to Covid, we will not be able to host our two-week winter homeless shelter in the Pastoral Center.


