

FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Fellow Parishioners of St. Benedict:

Happy Feast Day!

A parish, during Ordinary Time, is able to suspend the closest Sunday to its patronal feast to celebrate as a solemnity. This year we have the added benefit that the actual feast of St. Benedict is July 11th, so this weekend we are celebrating in style! We welcome our bishop, David M. O'Connell, C.M., to celebrate the 11:00 a.m. Mass with us. We are very happy that the bishop was able to put us on his calendar. It is always a joy for the parish to have the bishop with us.

At the Mass this weekend we are dedicating a new icon of St. Benedict that will be placed prominently in the front of the church. Matching the icons in the Hall of Saints, this will be a permanent reminder of our patron within the nave of the church itself. A year ago we were fortunate to procure a first class relic of St. Benedict, which is displayed in the reliquary standing next to his statue in the Hall of Saints.

Saint Benedict of Nursia (c. 480 - c. 547) is the founder of the Benedictine monastery at Monte Cassino (Italy) and the father of Western monasticism. The Rule that he established stands as the norm for monastic orders and communities in the church even today. In 1964, in view of the work of monks following the Benedictine Rule in the evangelization and civilization of so many European countries, Pope Paul VI proclaimed him the patron saint of all Europe. His twin sister, Saint Scholastica (d. 543) established monasteries for nuns following the same rule as Benedict. Together they forged the principles and disciplines of religious life. Various branches of the Benedictines emerged over the centuries, so besides the original community, such groups as the Trappists and Cistercians are in the Benedictine family. Two Benedictine monasteries remain in New Jersey: St. Benedict in Newark and St. Mary in Morristown. I know many of you are graduates of St. Benedict's Prep in Newark.

This week we will have the first week of the Summer Religious Education Academy. It is a good feeling to have the students back on campus, though some families have opted to remain virtual for the week. The more normal activities we can offer to our students the better they will adjust to the life moving forward. It has been such a challenging school year for so many students that I believe and opportunity such as this is a positive step forward. Thank you to all of the volunteers, and of course our staff of Mrs. Melissa Dayton, Miss Rachel den Hartog, Mr. Ciro Saverino, and our seminarian Anthony Gentile.

Next weekend we will hold our annual summer mission appeal. The Hospitaler Sisters of Mercy are making their appeal to assist with their work throughout the world. Here in New Jersey the Sisters operate Villa Raffaella in Pleasantville (Diocese of Camden) which is an assisted living facility. Due to their concerns over the pandemic, the Sisters will not be represented here next weekend, instead they will make a virtual appeal.

The weekend of July 24 – 25 we will celebrate the first World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly Occurring in the Year of St. Joseph, the theme "I am with you always" draws attention to the vital role grandparents and the elderly play in our communities and in the mission of the Church. We will focus more on the preparation and events next weekend.

Ministry to the Sick and Homebound

Parishioners who are ill or unable to get about are often the most neglected and in need. Please make contact with the parish office for any of the following ministries or services:

Anointing of the Sick – the priests will visit the persistently homebound at least twice per year but are available to come to your home anytime that there is a health crisis or a deteriorating condition. Please do not wait until the person is in the final stages of life – except for an emergency – to call for a priest.

Reception of Holy Communion – if a homebound parishioner would like to receive Holy Communion, please make contact with the parish office.

Hospital Nursing Homes – please call the office if a parishioner or a loved one is at Bayshore Community Hospital or has been moved into a local nursing home so that we can tend to the pastoral needs. For family members hospitalized outside of the area the in-house chaplaincy services can tend to the immediate needs. One of the priests will pay a visit as requested.

July 11, 2021 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Maybe the work is best left to the professionals. That's how many people view the preaching of the Gospel. That's the stuff priests, religious, deacons, lay ministers, and other professional Church people do. It has little to do with me. Well, that's not really true. The fact of the matter is that preaching the Gospel has everything to do with you, with all of us who are baptized members of the Body of Christ. Nobody gets off the hook from that job. The question is, however, how do we do it? Well, there's a safe way, which many choose, to preach the Gospel — and the risky way. The safe way pretty much keeps the Gospel in church and around like-minded people. I say my prayers, go to Mass, contribute to the food pantry, tithe, and attend Bible Study. That pretty much covers the bases, right? Wrong.

The risky way is the more challenging way and for many, the "road less traveled." Imagine those first disciples going out and into people's homes. They must have had some amazing conversations with folks about God's kingdom, changing their hearts, forgiving sins, and looking at the world differently. They must have met people who were hurting, exiled from their communities, neglected, lost, or living self-insulated lives in a society that served the rich and neglected the poor. While there were many who welcomed what they had to say and the conversations they had, there were others who no doubt rejected them and literally tossed them out on their ears! The Gospel, while being a message of joy and hope, is not always received well by those who are very comfortable keeping things as they are.

The risky way involves example and conversation. We have to take the Gospel from church and carry it with us wherever we go. What kinds of conversations do we have with others? We interact with those closest to us, in our work, social circles, institutions, corporations, in politics, and beyond. Our conversations with others reveal a great deal about how we see things and what we consider important. If we are really interested in seeing God's vision for the world succeed, then we will talk about it. It will become a part of our everyday conversation and find its way into our interactions with others. How will we preserve the dignity of human life and encourage others to have a relationship with God? We must be the example, live value centered, virtuous lives, stand against injustice, combating racism, and learn ways to resolve conflicts without violence.




Rachel's Vineyard Retreats for healing after abortion

Year of St. Joseph

July: Joseph Most Faithful

Fidelity connotes steadfastness. In the vicissitudes of life, one needs steadfast love, that is, fidelity, when encountering confusion, suffering, and failure. The image of Joseph finding a place in which the Child could be born was his movement in all of life. Failure simply meant one went on in fidelity and found by failure what God had intended for the fruitfulness of His will.

St Joseph, Most Faithful by Fr. David Huemmer, Chaplain & Spiritual Director

Faithfulness is one of the defining virtues of St. Joseph. It is the first one listed in St. Joseph Chapel here at the Retreat Center. Twelve of the virtues listed in the Litany of St. Joseph are found on the ceiling of the chapel. The Catechism of the Catholic Church helps to define faith in paragraph 143 stating, "By faith, man completely submits his intellect and his will to God. With his whole being, man gives his assent to God the revealer. Sacred Scripture calls this human response to God, the author of revelation, "the obedience of faith."

St. Joseph was a man who lived this definition of faith. To begin, in Matthew's gospel, St. Joseph is described as "a just man". Other versions translate the text saying he was " faithful to the law". Thus, as the Catechism states, St. Joseph submitted his intellect and his will to God. During this season of Christmas, we have, through the gospel stories proclaimed, been able to see this virtue of faithfulness in St. Joseph live out.

Even though St. Joseph never speaks a word, his actions speak of this deep faith. He shows faithfulness to the Lord when directed by the angel in a dream about taking Mary as his wife, and when asked to take Mary and Jesus to Egypt, he responds in faith by doing so without a word. Therefore, because of the virtue of his faithfulness, He is given to us as the model husband, father, and protector.



The Presentation of Jesus in the Temple Fra Angelico (ca 1540)

As the sun was setting on the medieval world, new depictions of Saint Joseph and the Holy Family began to emerge. None of these works were more impactful and timeless than the warm and immediate images found in the frescoes of the Dominican painter, Guido di Pietro, known most often today as Fra Angelico.

The Presentation of Jesus in the Temple, painted between 1540 and 1542 is a fresco by Fra Angelico made for the Dominican convent of San Marco in Florence during the time when the artist was prior there. This is one of a limited number of frescoes whose composition and color confirm with some certainty that Fra Angelico executed most of the work himself. The scene is serene, but immediate with warm tones and an earthly setting lacking the gold embellishments Fra Angelico was known to use skillfully in his wealthy commissions. This scene was painted in a monk's cell for the purpose of contemplation.

Here Joseph is placed on the same visual plain as The Virgin, standing with her as husband and wife. She presents her Son to Simeon as Joseph presents the customary offering. Joseph is neither old nor young, but a fitting compliment to Mary. In the foreground just before them, Saint Peter Martyr and the Blessed Villana of the Dominican Order contemplate the scene. It is also interesting to note that the image of Joseph bears a striking resemblance to other works of Blessed Fra Angelico that are identified as self-portraits, thus suggesting that the Prior/Artist may well have looked to Joseph as a patron and example as he served his brother Dominicans.
