Dear Church Family,

There are many times of joy and grace in the life of a Pastor, and we as clergy live for these moments. There are times of sorrow and pain as well. Some of these more somber moments are marked with the fingerprints of God, for instance when His grace is present with us as we mourn the passing of a soul from this life to the next, and his fingerprints can be found in the most unexpected places in the midst of sorrow.

Unfortunately, today I must undertake a different type of unpleasant task, and I can only pray that the Lord's grace will appear here as well.

As I fulfill the solemn duty of fraternal correction, I'm reminded of that moment in Acts 6 where the Hellenists bemoaned the fact that their widows were not being taken care of in the daily distribution of bread; the Apostles came up with a solution to make sure that everyone's needs were being met.

In this time of pandemic, our Church community finds a variety of needs surfacing and she must address them. Recently our Bishop mandated the use of masks at all liturgies to mitigate the spread of COVID 19; and despite the rampant increase of cases of infection in Union County, and the increase in deaths related to COVID 19 in our own Church family, there are those in our community who refuse to follow the bishop's directive.

Our bishop has asked that we as Pastors NOT refuse to admit to the celebration of the liturgy those who will not comply with the mask mandate; I understand wholeheartedly the desire of our shepherd to not shut off the grace of Mass and worship to anyone, as worshipping God is a duty we all have and is very much needed in our society today. However, I would ask those who refuse to wear a mask to consider our Bishop's words, "Simple charity obliges us to take into account the physical and psychic health of others as a way to ensure that worship is relatively safe and accessible to as many parishioners as possible. None of us wants to be the cause for someone else to withdraw or refrain from Mass attendance because certain members of a congregation fail to employ this basic means of protection for our neighbor."

I am acutely aware of the painful decision made by some of the members of our community who are in the vulnerable population and do not want to expose themselves or their loved ones to COVID-19: They have chosen to forego Sunday worship in order to avoid exposure to the virus. Realizing that listening to Mass on the radio or watching it on the internet is a poor substitute for in-person worship, these same people have instead started coming to daily Mass. I want to leave open to them the possibility of coming to daily Mass in a manner that engenders a sense of safety.

As your Pastor, mindful of the needs of so many of the faithful who now attend daily Mass instead of Sunday Mass, I must insist that masks be worn by everyone at all DAILY masses, lest we deprive the holy sacrifice of the Mass to those who won't come if safety measures aren't adhered to. I'm not granting permission to ignore the mask mandate on Sundays, rather I'm being especially insistent that it be followed at daily liturgies. If the directive of the bishop is not enough, if my humble pleading is not sufficient, then for the love of God and the respect of your neighbor please either wear a mask at Mass or refrain from attending any Mass other than one on Sunday. This should allow the greatest number of our parishioners of all dispositions to continue to enjoy the holy sacrifice of the Mass at least once a week.



Dear Parish Members,

I recently had an opportunity to attend a presentation by Jeanne Wells, executive director of the Catholic Tuition Organization, on the impact of CTO on our schools and families. The information was presented in a way that makes us realize how important CTO is to the ongoing success of our schools. When you look at the attached chart, you will discover some amazing benefits but also great challenges our schools face. Some overall information about our schools and families:

...9 of our 16 schools receive CTO assistance for 40% OR MORE of their students

...37% of all of our students receive CTO (K-12)

...our average family is 4.3 individuals, with an average income of \$58,006

...If that family have 1 high school student and 1 elementary student, their annual tuition would be approximately \$11,966 ... or 21% of their gross income (that would be like a second house payment for these families!)

As Jeanne pointed out, 'that the majority of these families would not attend our Catholic schools without CTO'. If we lost 2,063 students because of the lack of tuition assistance, what would happen to our schools?

YOUR HELP IS NEEDED! As you all know, many of our families have suffered more struggles because of COVID. Fortunately, CTO has the opportunity to raise even more money this year than last year, which is wonderful because our families will absolutely need it for tuition for the 2021-22 school year. There is only 4 weeks left to raise \$1 million.

HOLY SPIRIT PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL MINUTES

November 17, 2020

Holy Spirit Parish Council members met at Holy Spirit (HS) Hall. Pastor Father Adam Westphal led the opening prayer. Present were Fr. Adam, Jacquie Eblen, Joni Taylor, Phyllis Allen, Lisa Miller, Mark O'Riley, Ronda Katzer, Barb Hudson, Joni Thelen and Michelle Moore (recording secretary). Motion was made by Lisa to approve the Oct. 2020 meeting minutes, Jacquie seconded, all approved. Fr. Adam Comments: The Rerun Thrift shop will be open 9-5 on Monday until Christmas. We are very light on volunteers, but 3 people have signed up to help. We are still looking for more volunteers. We are following the State and Diocese guidelines for public health safety at the Rerun and the Church. Masks are required at the Rerun and at Mass. We have posted signs on the church, posted info on FB, and emailed parishioners. Our method of communication worked well with the mask mandate. We had 95% compliance at Holy Spirit (HS) and 100% compliance at St. Edward (SE). The Diocese has suspended all parish or hosted social events beginning Nov. 23 through Jan. 10. There will likely be more changes to come. If everyone following through with their pledges amounts for the ADA, we will make our ADA goal for both HS and SE. Committee Reports: Building and Grounds/ Safety Committee: Remodeling of the men's bathroom at HS Hall will start sometime after Thanksgiving. Fr. Adam, Phyllis, and Michelle had short safety meetings on Nov. 9 and Nov.10 to discuss public health safety updates. Family Life: The Lighted Christmas Parade has been canceled. Social Concerns: Matura gives a list of gifts for about 37 kids. The Giving Tree is set up at HS and unwrapped gifts need to be back by Dec. 8th. Liturgy: They are getting ready for Advent. Finance: Randy worked on the end year financials (July 1, 2019 - June 30, 2020) and there was a deficit this year. This report will be sent out to HS parishioners at the end of the year. Faith Formation: The 7th/8th grades class did a Saints parade on Oct. 28. First Reconciliation was held Nov. 4 with no prayer service this year, but all students completed their sacrament. There have been lots of RE subs and attendance has been down due to Covid. The plan is to do some online learning for grades 1-8 if we are not back in the building. The confirmation kids did a service project to collect food for the pantry. St. Malachy: Fr. Fridays have been going well and kids like asking Fr. questions. Reading and fluency scores are good. The owl cameras have arrived. The STM students and Steve Heffern worked on videotaping the CHS musical. RCIA: There are 3 families attending RCIA on either Sunday or Friday. They did not meet last week due being quarantined. Christmas Dinner: The Diocese approved the request for HS to have a drive up Christmas Dinner. Anita Studer and Barb Hudson are working on the details. They will use the STM kitchen and have 4 cars for deliveries. Call the parish office to make a reservation for a meal. Bulletins: Mark suggested sending out bulletins to people that don't have a computer. Fr. Adam will make a radio announcement. Bulletins can be found on our website (www.uccat.org). If you don't have a computer, contact Michelle at the parish office. Policy Review: The HS Hall rental policy and the HS/SE Wedding Policy was reviewed. Some suggestions were made; a draft will be sent out for review. Michelle will check with the Diocese on the proof of liability insurance. The old tables and chairs are considered the round tables and folding chairs in the closet. There was some discussion on how to improve the cleanliness of the Hall. The meeting ended in prayer. Next meeting will be Jan.19 at 6:30 p.m. Holy Spirit Hall. Mark moved to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Lisa. Meeting adjourned. Recap of St. Edward Parish/ Financial Council meeting Nov. 15, 2020

St. Edward Council met after Mass on Nov. 15. Present were Fr. Adam, Dennis Hopkins, Dan McNeill, and Alex Pettit. Absent: Shayla Findley and Sharon Swanson.

Sept. minutes were approved. October Statement of Activities and Statement of Financial Position for St. Edward and Paul VI were reviewed and approved. The Council need one more member. Please contact Fr. Adam if you would like to volunteer.

Other: A retreat flyer was reviewed and tabled due to low attendance at church.

RE: Council voted to get RE teachers/helpers small gift for Christmas gift. Darren Moore fixed hole in Rectory building and building was sprayed for wasps. RE catechists are working on ways to find people that would be interested in learning more or attending training on Catechesis of the Good Shepherd to help build the Religious Education program. Contact Fr. Adam if you are interested.

Grounds: Mike Rollings will not be doing snow removal this year. Thank you for the many years of service and help with the church. Tonelli Seasonal Service bid for snow removal was reviewed and approved.

Dennis Ripperger memorial money was received and dedicated to fixing the East retaining wall. Meeting adjourned, next meeting will be Jan.17, 2021
