Greetings once again, and best wishes for a very good month of October as we enter into the Autumn!

A Sunday Reflection

As we hear in today's Bible readings during the Sunday Liturgy, marriage and family life are meant to be true blessings from the Almighty. Going back to the ancient Hebrew tradition found in the Old Testament Book of Genesis, the permanent union of one man and one woman has been seen for millennia as a sacred partnership blessed by God. Likewise, Christian Marriage continues to be a sacred partnership, a sacrament blessed and sanctified by the Lord Jesus in today's Gospel according to Mark.

Throughout Christian history, many men and women have found Christian Marriage and Christian family life to be wonderful gifts and blessings in which a covenant and community of love is lived every day. Especially in today's society, every Christian Marriage and every Christian family deserves our admiration and support and prayers.

Of course, for many married couples and families, life together today is filled with its challenges and stress. We all know those whose marriages have not lasted and whose families have been torn asunder. These husbands, wives, children, and families also need our care and understanding. No one enters into marriage thinking or hoping that it won't last. Unfortunately the difficulties of life today make marriage and family very difficult and challenging for so many.

Over the years, I've come to share this pastoral advice with as many spouses and parents as I can. First, husbands and wives might find it very beneficial to share seven (7) hugs and kisses EVERY DAY to show your devotion and love to each other and to keep your romance alive. Second, parents would do well to limit the presence of electronics in your home. Make your family life more peaceful and calm by turning off the television, the computer, your smartphones, and the radio as much as you possibly can. Our brains, nerves,

hearts, souls, and families need a break from all the electronic pollution and poison that has unfortunately infiltrated every moment and aspect of our lives. Try more peace and quiet in your home. You may come to love the quiet!

Today, Jesus clearly affirms the goodness and importance of Christian Marriage and family life. They are divine gifts to humanity and to the Church which give us stable families and homes and lives. May all of our husbands, wives, children, and families be blessed in your life together, and may all members of the Catholic Church respect, support, and pray for all families as they live out their lives as spouses, parents, and children. 

In addition to your "stuff," we pride ourselves on our quality bake sale, so keep in mind that may be a way you can help.





Pilgrims from around the world travel to Perugia to see the relic and venerate it. Blessed Pope Pius IX venerated the ring on May 10, 1857 when visiting Perugia.

CLASSROOM CHRONICLES: Each week we will highlight the amazing things that are going on in our classrooms here at Guardian Angel Academy.

MR. ROY FISCHER'S CLASSROOM: The 7^{th} and 8^{th} grade students have spent the week learning how to login to their Google Classroom accounts. Each student in the middle school has a Chromebook for classroom use. In addition to using them to complete writing assignments, the 7th and 8th graders also used their Chromebooks to assist in their chapter reviews, by playing an online game called Kahoot! The students use their Chromebooks as "buzzers" in a trivia game to prepare for their tests. It keeps track of their accuracy and speed in answering the questions. The students got very competitive in their Kahoot review.

In 8th grade Social Studies, students are just beginning to study the Civil War. In addition to their normal classwork, the 8th grade will also begin an in-depth study of photography during the Civil War, searching an online depository and the Library of Congress, for pictures of soldiers and battlefields. Then, the students will reproduce their own photographs in the style of Civil War photojournalist!

The 7th grade Social Studies class is finishing up their Chapter 1, The Roots of American People. In this section, we studied the migration of early humans to North America, including a review of Native American groups living here in Western Pennsylvania. The students were shocked to learn about McKees Rocks Mound, a Mound Builder burial site right here in our own community!

Next week, we will be moving into the age of European colonialism of the American continent. Students will study Columbus's journey to the New World, as well as other explorers.

For Reading, both 7th grade and 8th grade started their novels. The 7th grade started The Giver, by Lois Lowry, while the 8th grade began To Kill a Mockingbird by Harper Lee. The Giver contains many themes of a supposed "utopia" which allows the students to discuss difficult

moral questions while also allowing us to incorporate our Catholic faith into the classroom discussions. To Kill a Mockingbird depicts life in a Southern town and deals with issues such as injustice and equality. Students will be able to make many connections between this novel and our study of the Civil War.

- Your total gross household income must be at or below 80% of the Allegheny County average median income. The monthly income limit for a household of one is \$3,958, a household of two is \$4,525, three is \$5,092 and four is \$5,654.
